Letters had been delivered by hand to all the candidates standing in the Town and City elections on May 3rd., cordially inviting the successful candidates to come to our forum meeting on Monday, 21st May, at 7.30 p.m., to give us a flavour of how they wish to serve Sutton Vesey and, in particular, the residents of Banners Gate. The new councillors will have the same amount of time to have their say, how long will depend on how many turn up. We will then have our free coffee break when new councillors, and the residents present, will have the opportunity to informally chat. **All residents are welcome**.

From our newly elected Town & City Councillors

Clir. Rob Pocock: "I want to thank the residents of Banners Gate and Parklands for the tremendous vote of confidence at the recent elections. Topping the poll is a very generous level of public endorsement, and I'm very grateful for the support. But there is now a lot to be done to make the Town Council work more effectively for local residents. I have been increasingly critical of the priorities they have shown over the first two years, and from my conversations with residents during the elections I'm aware many local people also share this view. Too much time and money has gone onto vanity projects like the concert in the Park, ceremonials and the like. Not enough has been done to provide the basic Town Council services to residents. This needs to be corrected. I will do all I can to lobby and pressurise the Town Council leadership to change tack.

Another thing that has gone wrong, is that there is too much political control from the centre. The money from the Precept needs to be devolved more locally, to neighbourhoods like ours, so that local residents can have more say in what is done with THEIR money. Finally, it needs to be made more clear, as to what the Town Council does, and what the City Council does. People are confused about this. The Councils of Birmingham and Sutton need to work better together, and not be at loggerheads all the time. That does no-one any good. As I am now elected both as your City and Town Councillor, I will be making a major priority to improve these relationships in the coming period. With many thanks again for your great vote of support." Cllr. Louise Passey: "The only message from myself is a massive big thank you to the residents of Vesey for electing me to Town Council. I'm delighted and very honoured to serve Vesey Ward for the next four years! Looking forward to making great progress to make Vesey Ward and Sutton Coldfield an even better place to live! '

Clir. Kath Scott: "It is a great honour to have been selected to represent the Sutton Vesey Ward, alongside Rob Pocock, at Birmingham City Council. I would like to thank each and every person that voted. I promise to repay the huge public support fully and robustly over the next 4 years. With labour now having full control over the Ward I'm looking forward to a really positive future where Rob and I WILL make a huge difference. We will get things done. We will fully represent residents with honour and integrity because we are a team you can trust."

I have also led an application to the Charities Commission and to date the Sutton Coldfield Disability Action Group are waiting to confirm status this month. Also, we have an application to Awards for All to fund associated activities and again we will know if we have been successful this coming month."

Minutes of the Banners Gate (Sutton Vesey) Neighbourhood Forum AGM meeting held in Banners Gate Community Hall on Monday 26^h March. 2018 at 7.30 p.m.

1. Apologies. Jean & Tony Smith; Hazel Pollock; Carole Smith; Harold Jones; Mike Hughes 2. Minutes of last meeting. These were passed in the May 2017 meeting

3. Annual Reports. Gatepost is more popular than ever but more adverts need more space and sheets of paper. There are 39 deliverers covering 44 streets. There has been a successful bid for extra money and £600 was given by the Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council which adds to the usual £500 grant from Birmingham City Council. The forum has also secured £9,686 for a Social Media Awareness Course which is ongoing and delivered at the Age Concern Communitea room in Boldmere Road. A separate account has been set up for this grant for the course. Some of the grant for the Social Media Awareness Course is also to be spent on one coloured and stapled issue of the Gatepost newsletter.

There have been six speakers during the year but John Porter has missed a few times due to various reasons. The annual income from the adverts is £440; Standing Orders give £160 and donations coming in as cheques give £620, which totals to £1220. Sixteen years ago there was a very different situation when the forum was able to give a donation of money towards the Banners Gate playground in the park.

Jean Smith, who has been our excellent Minutes Secretary for many years has had to retire due to illness and so we need someone to volunteer for the role

5. Standing Orders

Meetings take place bi-monthly on the last Monday of the month except for May when it is the penultimate Monday. The meetings start at 7.30 pm. with a speaker, then a free coffee break and then the official meeting. The meeting usually finishes at 9.30 pm.

Minutes of the Banners Gate (Sutton Vesey) Neighbourhood Forum ordinary meeting held in Banners Gate Community Hall on Monday 26^h March, 2018 at 7.30 p.m.

Unfortunately, due to a diary error, for which he has fully apologised, Karl Randall, the expected speaker, did not appear.

Questions that were raised for Karl Randall.

The queuing of traffic along Banners Gate Road has improved but is still causing concern. There was a suggestion of a possible three way system at the traffic lights from Banners Gate Road to Monmouth Drive and Chester Road, like the one from Monmouth Drive to Banners Gate Road and Chester Road, and white lines to show how far forward to move when turning right onto Chester Road from Banners Gate Road. A similar traffic lights is to be found at the top of Bellwell Lane near the Four Oaks Pub at Mere Green. Councillor Pocock stated that there is a study going on by B.C.C. and Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council to survey traffic flow into Sutton Coldfield in order to look for pinch points. The results will generate a grant from Central Government to resolve issues highlighted by the research.

The service road in Queslett Road East: Access needs to be blocked off downhill to stop traffic from turning right into the service road which is a very dangerous manoeuvre. The white painted directions also need to be re-done.

Concern was expressed that the proposed Changing Places in Royal Sutton Coldfield would be in the wrong place. To access the facility there would need to be a larger lift space and tall vehicles, that disabled people often use, cannot park in Gracechurch multi-storey car park. Other problems for disabled parking spots are in Holland Street and outside Halifax Bank where the space needs to be marked out to encourage better parking. The dropped kerb there is often covered by parked cars.

The road surfaces in Somerville Road and along the top of Westwood Road from George Frederick Road are in a very bad state. Councillor Pocock advised that they should be back on the to-do list at the start of the financial year. Someone asked whether Amey would use plastic in the asphalt.

Crime check: On 29th August 2017 a car broke down near the King George V playing fields and was left there until February 2018 when the tax and insurance ran out. Unfortunately, there is no legislation that allowed it to be removed before then.

Please see the Birmingham City website **www.birmingham.gov.uk** for information about parking, roadworks and transport matters. There has been an increase in crime in the area; 36 in the local area and most were shoplifting at Princess Alice Shopping Centre. For burglary please make sure that small top windows are kept locked along with other windows as they can make access too easy.

Vehicle safety: There have been 9 vehicle crimes and, according to the RAC, it is a good idea to use a deterrent such as a steering lock to make stealing more difficult. There have been 2 criminal damage crimes, 2 robberies and 4 incidents of violence and sex crimes. In future a blog will be started to highlight these problems in the area Scams: Information has come from Trading Standards. £10 billion is lost to scammers each year and it is important to remember that an offer of money is always too good to be true, for example: prizes and telephone scams. Never pay in advance. Avoid doorstep scams by never agreeing to cold calling. Always ask for identification and put a chain on the door. Internet and phone scams - do not give your details nor your bank details.


Years Six and Two have been hard at work preparing for the SATS tests due later this month. Keep going, it will be worth it!

Late on Sunday afternoon, 22nd April, the fully-glazed back door of a house in Hollyhurst Road was smashed. The culprits first broke into a shed by removing a pane of glass, presumably to look for tools and may have used one to break the glass. The occupiers assume that the thieves must have been disturbed as nothing was taken. The security arrangements have been improved, including an inexpensive alarm that adheres to the glass and is set off if the glass is knocked or broken. Although nothing was taken it cost £237 to secure the door for the night and another £259 to replace the glass. Additional money has also been spent to improve security. All in all an expensive Sunday afternoon.

It is difficult to know what else you can do after changing to anti snap locks, but at less than £5 each you can buy a set of alarm and vibration sensors which is a comparatively inexpensive way of feeling more secure. Of course, if the doors are unlocked or windows are left open then your only hope is to buy a very large dog!

The topics include setting up an email address and sending a message; setting up a blog; setting up a website; instructions on what to do to comply with the new GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) becoming law this month; synchronising desktop to laptop to tablet to mobile phone; setting up/leaving and/or changing options in Facebook; joining and/or leaving LinkedIn; password problem with Virgin account; linking Android phone to Apple iPad and tethering from phones to laptops. From one of the participants, "It has provided an opportunity for me to find out about social media and which, if any, are suitable for me. The flexible and individualized nature of the sessions supports learning. The venue and the instructors are great too.


