From your Town and City Councillors

Allison Jolley: As councillors we are often invited to local community events, I particularly enjoy this aspect of being a councillor as it's an ideal opportunity to meet others in an informal and relaxed atmosphere. An example of this was just a few weeks ago on 17th July, when St Columba's Church Banners Gate formally welcomed the Reverend Beccy Allen as their new Vicar at a service of celebration. I was very pleased to accept an invitation to attend this occasion and also to be asked to give a few warm words of welcome on behalf of the Sutton Coldfield Town Council during the service. The Church was full and it was good to see so many people of all ages enjoying the service. The choir were in good voice and afterwards a vast array of home-made cakes and other tempting refreshments in the Hall ensured the best welcome possible for Beccy, her husband Dave and also their family and friends.

During the last few weeks I have also been speaking to residents that have wished to ask advice particular to their own circumstances and also supporting them further as required.

Rob Pocock: have been busy over the past month working with Kath Scott on launching the new plans for greater local democracy in the Sutton Vesey Ward. This is a new scheme from the City Council to try and make sure that local services are more in tune with what people want. It also means a stronger voice for organised residents' groups like the excellent Banners Gate Neighbourhood Forum. To launch the scheme, Kath and I are organising the first-ever ' Vesey Ward Community Conference' which will be held on Saturday, 29th September, 2.30pm in the Carpenters Arms Community Hall in Boldmere. All residents welcome!

My other aim this month has been making further efforts to prevent the mobile phone mast that the telecoms company are proposing to erect by St Columbus Church. I have had meetings with the Council Planners about it and will report on progress at the September meeting of the Neighbourhood Forum. **Kath Scott**: It's been a busy but rewarding Summer, juggling family life and the Councillor role. I have also been very busy with the Carers Campaign, launched last Autumn. Soon, we will be getting a 'Local Area Coordinator' who will be out and about, assisting older people with care support. If you know of anyone who seems a bit isolated or needs help, you can email me on kate.scott@birmingham.gov.uk and I'll let you know how to follow this up.

September began with a focus on the Scrutiny committee that I am on (Learning, Culture & Physical Activity Overview & Scrutiny Committee). This month's committee was a great opportunity to feedback on school place planning & child mental health services. My campaigning began here as a local parent in 2012 focussing on Schools issues, and it is a real privilege to be able now to take all that invaluable experience I have gained over the last six years, into the heart of the Council where the actual decisions are made. It's great to be able to give our community a real 'voice' feeding back issues and concerns that are specific, measurable, timely and accurate and I hope to influence change for the better via the Scrutiny Committee that I serve on

Louise Passey: It has been a very long hot summer! Britain In Bloom was quite an experience for our Town and the judges were shown around a number of areas to look at the wonderful floral displays and community projects. The results should soon be available to see how well we did!

I have been working with my fellow Town Councillors to develop a strategy for Vesey Ward with key priorities that were within the Conservative Manifesto 'Standing Up For Sutton'. This involves new projects and how more services could be managed locally. I believe it is important that residents are able to meet

Minutes of the Banners Gate (Sutton Vesey) Neighbourhood Forum meeting held at Banners Gate Community Hall on Monday 30th July, 2018 at 7.30 p.m.

First speaker was Karl Randall. Karl is the Senior engineer of 15 wards, 30 carparks, works closely with 6 schools, and has just finished at Plantsbrook and also works with colleges. The new budget for the next 6 years is in the progress of liaising with councillors and Sutton Town Council. Penny Lane and Lindridge Road now have additional signs. A resident added that when last checked there were 50 pelican crossings which were non-compliant. Amey took control in January 2010 for 25 years, prior to this it was Birmingham City Council. Another resident asked about more double yellow lines and Karl had met with councillors to look at budgets and priorities. Karl confirmed that he had 20 requests and there is a meeting to discuss these on 14 August.

Councillor Jan Cairns confirmed that Modeshift STARS, which is a government initiative to support schools that promote cycling, walking, etc., had been taken up by most schools in the area. Recently, parents who disregarded signs outside schools were given £70 parking fines. A resident in Queslett Road highlighted the service road where she lives, it has the 20 mph signs, but these were not sufficient - can signs be repainted? One side of Queslett Road is on the Walsall side of the road and they would have to be contacted separately if there was a need to change the use of the gap in the central reservation as drivers were entering from the wrong direction.

A Chester RN resident had a problem as yellow signs lines have been disregarded since 2004. When recently ringing up Severn Trent about the alleyway being repaired he was told it is not their job but the council's. The drains are not big enough and flood gardens when they overflow. Karl confirmed that the underground sewage system cannot cope. Drainage now comes

under Severn Trent.

A resident of George Frederick Road confirmed that Amey did the work on the three-stage process of traffic management on the Monmouth Road junction and it works.

Karl was asked to look at the Chester Road North junction as the road surface was bad.

Three points were added by the Chair:
Banners Gate Road; Amey had dug the flowers up so would it be possible to have them back?
The road passing Wyndley Leisure Centre to Upper Clifton Road is bad, Karl confirmed that was planned work 6 or 7 years ago and only patches are being repaired at the moment. Is this road patching going to be good for the whole of the 30 years contract?

Karl was asked about the sealing of the patches and said that Birmingham City Council have told those working on these patches to not seal the edges. Karl confirmed that over-banding the patches is not needed.

The cushions in the road outside of schools reduces casualties, e.g., Plantsbrook. It is hard to get justification to put these in as the cost is typically £68,000. Road humps go across the road whereas cushions go part way across, are of a certain height and width and allow large vehicles such as ambulances and fire engines to pass easily. The Chair asked about dropped curbs as sometimes it is hard to travel along pavements in a wheelchair, especially from Westwood Road to the school. These would cost around £1200 each. Parking on verges is also a problem. Karl added that Sutton Oak Road is being looked at, and Chester Road North could also be a problem. The Police should be contacted regarding obstructing pavements as Karl's department only has Civil powers. It was pointed out that this parking causes issues for visually impaired, people in wheelchairs and for anyone pushing a buggy.

Karl was thanked with a round of applause. The second speaker was Councillor Pocock.

The proposed mast on the corner by St. Columba's Church was the first concern as the companies. EE and Vodaphone, were looking at this location to put their mast. It was at the first stage of the planning application. They were required by law to provide coverage. The 2nd official planning stage was due on 10 September. There are 58 days for the council to make a decision and on day 59 it would go through. The main objection is the unsuitability of the location. The 'Health' issues will not work because, since 2015 the mobile phone companies have permitted rights and can appeal a decision. Currently, the mast is on the Seven Trent land and they have been given notice to quit. The Church are aware of the situation and they will object.

A discussion followed of where there are currently masts. We need to mobilise all the residents who use the affected routes. The real issue is quality rather than quantity in the response. The 65 feet mast will consist of five cabinets that need servicing, two 300cm dishes and three shrouded antennas the 65 feet high mast will also have generators that need servicing.

Travellers on King George Playing Field.
A new law has recently been proposed and
Birmingham City Council is considering it. If it
goes through it will involve having to obtain
permission to enter green spaces.

The Police were able to block the entrance but have no legal powers to stop them getting onto the field. If peaceful the travellers know that they could ask the Police to move. A Court Order can be obtained, and the travellers have 48 hours to vacate voluntarily. If not, then the Bailiffs can get an eviction notice. Birmingham City Council are applying for all places throughout the city for the new law, allowing Police greater powers, but places must been found to house the travellers. There are three places where the travellers can go. Currently there is one in Castle Vale and two others near industrial sites.

If you can get a photo of them breaking locks this would help but would be difficult. The entrance could be made more secure as it was noticed that they had difficulty getting onto the site in their vans. They had moved from Perry Park to King George V Playing Fields.

As the questions session with Karl and Councillor Pocock had taken so much time it was decided to forgo our usual free coffee break and continue with the meeting. Apologies were received from Jean Smith,

Sutton Vesey plan would be a legal deal with the Council, with limited budgets, with time constraints. There would be a consultation process and councillors can veto if an idea is not usable. The town and city should play to their strengths.

Forum newsletter. A resident of Trinity ward had been in touch and needed information on what is needed to produce a newsletter similar to Gatepost. Currently, there is not a Forum in Trinity.

Social Media Awareness Course. A half dozen people are lined up who want to attend the next planned course. For information ring the editor, phone number at the bottom of the front page.

Clean Air Zone. A booklet was distributed, entitled Residents' Questionnaire, and residents who had thoughts on the subject were encouraged to fill it in, alternatively they could fill it in on the internet.

Friends of King George V Playing Field. We must work as a group on security and consider ways to reduce the means of entering the field. If the new law goes through that will help a great deal.

A Lost Drone and a Helicopter. These were found in gardens, one near The Greenway and one on the corner of Westwood Road. If anyone has any knowledge of these lost items please contact the Chair.


The next Town Council Meeting will be in the Town Hall on 25 September.

"Over the last few weeks we have seen a rise in theft of vehicle registration plates within the Sutton Coldfield area. There are two main reasons why a thief goes to the trouble of stealing your number plates. The first is to steal fuel; the thieves simply fit any old pair of number plates to their car, fill up with petrol or diesel and drive off. They then change the plates back to the proper ones leaving the petrol station owner with no idea of the car's true identity.

The second is more insidious. In this case the thief will try and steal a set of number plates from a similar car to his own in order to clone it on a long-term basis, allowing them to commit all sorts of vehicle crime with complete impunity.

This can easily be avoided by simply changing your number plate screws to anti-tamper screws. These can be brought from most motor vehicle stores but we are planning on conducting police surgeries within the area and we will be providing anti-tamper screws to anyone that requires them for free!!! Please keep a look out for our upcoming dates and we will look forward to seeing you then."


