Our speakers, at the meeting on Monday, 28th January at 7.30 p.m. in the Community Hall, are Ben East and the team from Fast Aid (http://www.fastaid.org.uk/). They will give us a demonstration on the use of a defibrillator especially because we are having one fitted to the Community Hall, thanks to the Sutton Coldfield Town Council. All residents of any age are welcome, especially those who use the hall for various activities, including the residents who run those activities. On March 25th again a demo but with our own newly installed defibrillator.

Again, thanks to the generosity of Sutton Coldfield Town Council the Community Hall will soon be host to a defibrillator. It will be installed on Monday, 4th February. Hopefully, leaders of classes at the hall, (you will be contacted), the participants in the classes and other residents, will be able to attend the demonstration by Fast Aid on Monday, 28th January (see above), and then by the Community Heartbeat Trust, who are installing the equipment, in the Forum meeting on Monday, 25th March. Please try to attend these demonstrations, not only to be able to use the defibrillator but also because **you** may be the one it is used on (or **me**, I'm knocking on a bit).

We are still in the process of obtaining funding for the next stage of our computing course. It is our intention to give instructions in the use of tablets, especially for residents who may have a smartphone but do not have a desktop and/or laptop computer.

The urgent need for this course has been emphasised by news in the papers today, as we type this article, that the government is planning for NHS to have consultations between doctors and patients via Skype, or by a similar method of consulting via the internet. We can show you how to do this as well as sending emails, viewing TV, renewing passports, etc. If you are interested in such a **FREE** course please let me

know (address and phone number at the bottom of the page) and you will be informed when and where the course will be run - it will be locally. Tablets will be available for your use during the sessions, or you can bring your own.

Rob Pocock: "I'm pleased to confirm that a massive £19 million has now been allocated for a new Bus Station 'interchange' in Sutton Town Centre. After years of stop-start, the go-ahead has now been given for a huge re-vamp to boost our faltering Town Centre.

I've been appointed by the City Council on to a consultative panel that is looking at possible sites. One option is the land between the station and beside the Station Pub. Another is the Brassington Avenue derelict land site. I'll be representing local residents at the discussions so please email me at rob.pocock@birmingham.gov.uk if you want me to express any views. The final options will be put out to public

discussion in the Spring, and a final decision taken later in the year on which site to develop. Work should then start on the re-build.

The scheme is part of the major £500 million Town Centre regeneration plan set_out by the City Council before Christmas (Urban Centres Framework). Most funding will be from businesses who would gain commercially by the long-overdue improvements. Let's hope we get some real

Last year was a brilliant success for Sutton in Bloom after being awarded a well-deserved RHS silver guilt medal. This time round we will be building on this achievement with many new projects that will continue to enhance our local area whilst encouraging residents, community groups, schools, etc., to get actively involved and support Bloom again this year. In fact I have already been contacted by a couple of community groups and also by Banners Gate residents. Kath Scott: "Happy New Year & welcome to 2019. It's been a very busy time since being elected and this year looks set to be the same. I attended the fabulous Carers Event held at Sutton's Gracechurch in late 2018; where I picked up some essential information and made

contact with several really useful organisations; if you need any information on any subject to do with Caring please contact me on kath.scott@birmingham.gov.uk. Our Vesey Ward Local Area Co-Ordinator candidates have been short-listed and interviews are being held mid-January. Good Luck to anyone applying, we are really looking forward to working with you in our great Vesey Community.

Our hard-working and ever-resourceful Vesey Ward Neighbourhood Police Team are out and about and more active than ever. With a new scheme for reporting parking issues put in place by PCSO Ian Willetts, new Neighbourhood Watch schemes being regularly set up and a Streetwatch Scheme coming soon; the team are flying! In addition, our PCSO's have set up a monthly street walk with Age Concern for people to meet, get to know the local area, raise safety concerns or issues, etc. The first walk is on Thursday, 31st January 2019, at 11am for a "Feed the Birds Walk"; it should last approximately 1 hour & starts and ends at Age Concern, Boldmere Road.

Since being elected in May 2018, I have been given the additional role of Cabinet Adviser on Transparency. Within my remit, I am to challenge the City, Officers, Cabinet & the Executive around all things relating to transparency, including

the process, the reasons why certain documents are classed as private or non-private and asking the awkward questions that will progress change. It's a long-term project and change will require enormous effort and trust. However, as your local Vesey Ward Councillor I am determined to fight for the freedom for all citizens of the City to have access to information in an easy to find and clear manner and to hold the City to account when necessary."



Manish Puri: "Happy New Year to you all in 2019! This year already seems set to see important changes affecting all of us to continue. Locally I believe the biggest issue is the future direction of the Town Centre and with that the Town itself. Birmingham City

Council's Urban Centres program, the potential investment in a Transport Hub through HS2, Sutton's place in the Big City Plan, all create a once in a lifetime opportunity to shape the direction of our Town, we need to ensure that direction is future facing. Sutton Coldfield is a town proud of its history but too often nostalgia for a mythical golden age can hobble our ambitions for the 21st century. And remember we are almost 20% through this century."



Jan Cairns: "Happy New Year to all Gatepost Readers and here's to a happy and prosperous year for Vesey Ward. Firstly I went to a very well attended public meeting at the Town Hall on the 18th December to hear what the Birmingham City

Council plans were for parking charges in Sutton Park and their continued maintenance and development of the park and I have to say I was very disappointed at the lack of information, data and support for the park that the BCC officers portrayed so in 2019 my bias will most definitely be to understand and support local management of the park to bring it back to Sutton Residents.

I will be supporting the work of the newly forming Health and Wellbeing Committee for SCTC and will strongly promote opportunities to add value for the wellbeing of Sutton residents

Alongside Tony Willis and other colleagues we have been successful in registering the charitable Incorporated Organisation the Sutton Coldfield Disability Action Group. We have also secured funding from Awards For All to start local projects to improve facilities for disabled people who live, work and socialise in Sutton Coldfield. Minutes of the Banners Gate (Sutton Vesey) Neighbourhood Forum meeting held at Banners Gate Community Hall on Monday 26th November, 2018 at 7.30 p.m.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous meeting, 24th September 2018 were agreed as correct. Proposed by Harold Jones ,

seconded by Joyce Glendenning

Matters Arising: Rubbish collections will hopefully become sorted as the new staff becomes more familiar with the new electronic system to provide more efficient routes.

There is an option to prevent the mast by St. Columba's church. They could use a mast that is already in use. People need to sign a petition to object to the mast. Any complaints about Queslett Road have to be shared with Walsall as the road is split into two.

Parking charges for entry to Sutton Park are under discussion.

Parking Concern in Longmoor Road: Cllr. Kath Scott was asked about the resizing of a three bedroomed house to a four bedroomed one in Longmoor Road. The development of property often increases the number of vehicles that have to be parked in the road. In that area of Longmoor Road there are 23 cars parked among 7 houses. Not only is it difficult for residents to access their own drives, but it is dangerous for the children coming and going to school as it is near to a gully through to Coppice View, which is used as access to the school. The junction with George Frederick Road is also very wide and the speed of the cars that turn into Longmoor Road makes it a dangerous junction for the children to cross. The comment was that perhaps the development was not in keeping with the area.

Funding for Courses: Cllr. Janet Cairns has been awarded some money for accessibility projects in Sutton Coldfield, further details next meeting.

The previous computer course turned out to be eighteen sessions rather than just twelve and more are planned. The aim is to help people with questions like: How do I use my phone for the internet? How do I synchronise my phone to my laptop? How do I use What's App? There is a suggestion that tablets could be provided to teach more people to use Skype, watch television, access the government site and send emails. Six people have already signed up.

Boldmere Volunteer needed: Age Concern is recruiting for a volunteer from Boldmere as a Local Area Coordinator as part of the BCC's "Prevent First" vision. This will be someone to listen and help to solve problems. The Community Interview Day will be on Monday 14th January at Wylde Green United Reformed Church in Britwell Road, B73 5SW. Friends of King George V Playing Fields: Volunteers are

needed to plant bulbs. Tesco has given £2000 for bulbs to be planted in Banners Gate Road. Glendale will dig the trenches for the planting.

Speed camera in Monmouth Drive? Stonehouse Road will be closed on 14th January, 2019, to replace manhole covers. A resident said that there are three manhole covers that have sunk down in Bakers Lane and need attention. There is a roving speed monitor at the moment in Monmouth Drive collecting information for a possible crossing to enable people to get to Sutton Park more easily.

Blocked pavements by kerb parking. The gap left on the pavement has to be obviously too narrow for a wheelchair or a buggy to safely navigate. Please take photographs of the blockage and send them to PCSO Ian Willetts.

Neighbourhood Watch coordinator is Sue Atkins and you can find her contact details in the Gatepost Newsletter. The Blog also shares current information.

You can sign up to WM Now, use police number 101 and share information in the community via emails in groups of local people. Street Watch needs at least six people to start up a group with about two hours per month of time to monitor your area. Go out in twos and report anything to the police or the council. These groups can be set up to cover certain areas of Vesey Ward. There are What's App groups in Grendon Drive, one amongst Boldmere Traders' Association and amongst the Princess Alice Group of shops which are very helpful for the police.

There has to be permission to share the email addresses with the group, and not beyond the group, and care in the storage of these details. In addition to the coordinator for the Neighbourhood Watch scheme, helpers usually cover 10-15 properties.

Between 1st November and 26th November 2018 there were twenty-eight burglaries in the Banners Gate (Sutton Vesey) area. Seven attempted, three car key burglaries, two through the conservatory, two sheds /garages, six jewellery thefts and two where nothing was taken. A resident said that the drone that arrived in a garden on

New Year's Day, 2018, remains unclaimed.

Each walk lasts around an hour and starts at 11am at the Age Concern Communitea café in Boldmere. All welcome, including dogs!

We are also hoping to start a 'repair café', where a team of volunteer fixers get together in a friendly and sociable setting each month to show others how to mend broken household items which would otherwise be thrown away. It's a great opportunity to pass on skills and also reduce the amount of waste going into landfill so if you have practical knowledge in areas such as sewing, woodwork or DIY, and a few hours to spare each month, we'd love to hear from you. Age Concern's Communitea café is also home to a knitting group, a social group for ex-service personnel, support groups for Parkinson's, carers, Tinnitus and people who are deafblind and a sewing club. Our younger guests are also catered for on Friday mornings with our Baby Group and Story Time with Elsie. Communitea prides itself on being a friendly and welcoming venue at the heart of the community, serving a range of healthy and affordable food, sweet treats and daily specials. 




