Contributions from your councillors in the order they were received



Rob Pocock: There was a stunning turnout to the 'Community Safety Summit' that Kath and I organised for the Sutton Vesey ward area in July, and since then we have been busy working with the neighbourhood police to prioritise some of the actions coming out of that event. One outcome is that the Police are

going to prioritise setting up resident-led 'speedwatch' operations in our area to try and tackle speeding drivers. The idea is to create three teams of resident volunteers across the ward, covering Boldmere, New Oscott and of course a major priority, Banners Gate. You get to use a proper 'speed gun' that clocks speeding vehicles – quite a piece of kit! There is a training session coming up early in October, led by the local police. Banners Gate Forum AGM Minutes held at Banners Gate Community Hall on July 29th 2019

- **1. Apologies.** Mike Hughes, Hazel Pollock, Joyce Glendenning, Jan Cairns, & Rob Pocock.
- 2. Minutes. Minutes of previous meeting were accepted as correct.
- 3. Matters Arising. None.
- 4. Correspondence. None.
- **5. Vesey Ward meetings.** These are now well attended.
- **6. Computer Courses.** Funding for the purchase of tablets has been re-applied for after the first refusal. This is just under £10,000 to pay for the tuition costs and other expenses, including funding for several Gateposts to keep residents informed of its progress. We already have funding to purchase the tablets from Birmingham Airport. However, prices have gone up considerably since Trump caused a problem with Huawei, with Google now threatening to no longer supporting them. So, we have six Androids (Samsung Tab A) and three Apples (iPads). You can also bring your own tablets to use on the course. We are intending to start the course in September.
- 7. Blog at bannersgateneighbourhoodforum.com which is now instead of the website for local news. On 12th September there will be a Senior Showcase in Sutton Coldfield Town Hall from 12 noon until 4.00 pm. There is free entry to this event which gives support and ideas for anyone of retirement age, advising on legal and health issues, and activities and accommodation.

Bee Talk by Master Beekeeper, Julian Routh
Bees, an "Up-to-Date on Decline" by Julian Routh.
Julian Routh is a local master beekeeper with forty years' experience in training others to keep bees.
Bees are insects of the order Hymenoptera and descended

from wasps and developed with flowering plants 100 million years ago. They feed on pollen and nectar from plants, which they store to feed their larvae. They have featherlike side branches which they use to collect the pollen. There are solitary bees, semi-social bees and social bees. There are 250 species of solitary bees in the U.K. and they are good pollinators. There are 23 species of semi-social bees and they are used commercially in greenhouses. There is only one species of social bees in the U.K. and they are good pollinators and produce honey and wax. Solitary bees live as single insects that emerge for a flowering period. They mate soon after emergence and lay up to six eggs in a hollow tube with a supply of pollen and nectar. Their eggs will develop the following year. Leaf cutter bees cover the entrance with a piece of leaf. Some nest underground; Mason bees make pots out of the soil; and Carpenter bees chew wood to build their nests. Usually, they only fly about 150 metres from their nests. They depend on specific flowers to survive and use the day length to trigger their emergence. So, if the plants flower earlier than usual the bees can miss their food and their development cycle.

The smallest bee in the U.K. is the Scissor bee which is 6mm long and lives in woodworm holes. The Tawny mining bee cannot sting. Wallace's Giant bee, a carpenter bee and at least four times larger than a honeybee, is the largest bee in the world and after being thought to be extinct was found in 2018 on an Indonesian island.

Semi-social bees are commonly known as bumblebees and only the queen lives through the winter. A colony of 200/300 bees builds up in the spring and new queens emerge in late July. They feed up ready for the winter and the rest of the colony dies. They only fly about 500 metres from the nest. New diseases and parasites can be imported with bumblebee colonies and there is no honey stored in a bumblebee nest. The Tree bumblebee came into the country in 2001 and has an orange and white bottom. The only social bee is the Honeybee which is commercially managed, and a colony consists of 60,000 to 80,000 bees.

Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council seeks views on draft Strategic Plan

Residents and community groups of the Royal Town of Sutton Coldfield, those who work in the town and key partner organisations are being asked to share their views on the Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council's draft Strategic Plan, launched today (Monday 2 September).



The draft plan has been created following the results of an online 2018 survey,

feedback from meetings, events, social media and the 24 Councillors. The Town Council now seeks the public's views on the seven key priorities detailed in the draft plan, via an online survey.

Residents of Royal Sutton Coldfield pay a precept to the Town Council, in addition to their Birmingham City Council Tax (BCC). The Town Council is therefore committed to providing real improvements in our Royal Town, ensuring residents' needs are represented and that the precept is spent effectively and efficiently. The results of the draft Strategic Plan survey will be used by the Town Council to better understand how to allocate resources over the coming years and will underpin each of the seven key priorities set out in the plan.

Cllr Simon Ward, Leader of the Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council, said:

"We're very proud of what we have achieved since the creation of the Town Council in 2016 and we have real ambitions to do much more for our Royal Town. The priorities outlined in the draft Strategic Plan for 2020 – 2023 are what we know matter to the people who live and work here. What we need now is to decide how best to meet those priorities, which is why views from the survey will be key in positively shaping the future of Royal Sutton Coldfield." Residents, community groups, key partner organisations and those who work in Sutton Coldfield now have five weeks to give their views on the draft Strategic Plan, via the online survey before midnight Friday 11 October 2019. To read the draft Strategic Plan and access the online survey, please see the Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council's website: www.suttoncoldfieldtowncouncil.gov.uk Following the consultation period, the Strategic Plan 2020 – 2023 will be presented at Full Council in October 2019 and later shared on the Town Council website.

The Town Council is currently in discussions with Birmingham City Council about taking on, enhancing and having greater influence over a range of services provided by them – known as a devolution deal. The Town Council is leading plans to regenerate Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Centre and has also pledged to work to safeguard the iconic Sutton Park.

From Clir Rob Pocock: Thanks to eagle-eyed residents I was tipped off within minutes about the latest travellers visit last night (Monday) and that evening I contacted the Evictions Officers to start the enforcement process. We are in the same position as last time, which is a wretched rigmarole of legal stages before they can actually be physically thrown off. The Magistrates Courts need to serve an injunction and then the law allows them 48 hours to leave voluntarily. If they defy this then the police need to secure a further enforcement order which if still defied gives them legal powers to physically throw them out. But these powers are only available to the police after going through all these steps first. So this morning I went onto the site with the City Council Enforcement Officer who successfully issued the injunction notice. This went ahead without any difficulties, I'm pleased to say. They now have till Thursday to leave voluntarily. If not happen then the Police are empowered to undertake an enforced removal. You may recall I and other Councillors are pushing across Birmingham, to get the Magistrates to agree a 'blanket injunction' covering all public parks in the City. If the Magistrates Court agreed that, then the police would have the powers to act straight away. The Magistrates seem reluctant to grant the police and Council these advance powers, but without national legislation giving tougher police powers, this is what we need to get them to do locally and I'm one of many councillors who are lobbying them to do this.

To get this approved in the Courts, the City Council have to provide properly designated travellers campsites and this has taken quite a while to get approved. Not surprisingly, despite the sites being in mainly industrial areas at a distance from houses, there have still been some local residents objecting. These objections have now been overcome and the final approved site should be up and running by October. From then, the Police can use powers straight away to direct travellers to these designated sites. The City council can then also finally ask the Courts for the 'blanket injunction' powers.

So far as the King George site security is concerned, this was not sufficient to withstand the assault on Monday and this needs looking at further. However I'll be honest here, as one of the travellers told me last time, "If we want to get on there mate, don't worry we have the kit for it, whatever you do". For this reason I do not believe site security is a fail-safe step, and the more effective route is going to be the legal powers and the provision of proper designated sites. (Thanks to the good work of everyone involved, they were no longer there on Friday morning, Ed)





Sutton Coldfield Neighbourhood Network Scheme

We are creating a map of all of the community assets and activities in the Sutton Coldfield constituency, which can help people aged 50+ to lead independent, happy and healthy lives.

Community assets are individuals, groups or organisations who are doing something or delivering an activity, project or service in a neighbourhood setting which older people can benefit from. This can be anything from a lunch club to a line dancing class, befriending to benefits advice, or a support group to a sewing club.

As well as mapping community assets, we are also working with them to sustain and grow the activities and services they offer to citizens aged 50+ in the local area. We can offer a range of support around issues such as marketing and promotion, volunteering, governance and fundraising, and as part of this, we have a micro and small grants scheme which can fund certain activities and projects in Sutton Coldfield.

We also have opportunities for citizens aged 50+ who have experience of social isolation or are carers (looking after someone regularly because they are older, disabled or seriously ill), or who have experience of running a community based activity to get involved in developing the Neighbourhood Network Scheme in Sutton via our co-production group.




