To start with, our Town Rangers have been out and about providing more clean-

ups in our Ward, and in particular have been super-fast at addressing access issues. Where hedges are over-grown and blocking the pavements, making it difficult to pass if you are a wheelchair user, the Town Rangers have been out trimming back and opening up access. I'd like to say "A Big Thank You" for all the effort from our Town Rangers and ask, if there are any other issues in the Ward you feel need addressing, please contact me.

Even Greater News: Our brilliant Vesey Ward has been awarded EXTRA MONEY to spend on our highways ambitions and this includes my accessible Vesey Ward campaign. In addition to the dropped kerbs already on the way in areas such as Banners Gate, I am now aiming to deliver EVEN MORE dropped kerbs across our Ward, ensuring greater accessibility to people with mobility issues. So, if there is a particular road/area you feel would benefit please email me.

In other news on accessibility, we are delving into a scheme ensuring our Sutton Park becomes more inclusive for anyone who has difficulty walking, through an off-road mobility scooter hire, providing safe & enjoyable access to the park. Email me to be part of this.

Each area has a voluntary sector 'Locality Lead' and staff from a range of services. Our locality lead for Sutton Coldfield is <u>Spurgeons</u>. As one of ten Locality Hubs they will have close relationships with partners and communities, so they can help

the whole family. For example: provide family support, give advice and guidance including linking to food banks, connect families to the professionals who can support them and coordinate the help, support early help assessments, connect families into the local community resources to help families to be more resilient, and give small grants for emergency food assistance.

Rob Pocock: The problem of speeding traffic has been getting out of hand recently, and I've been working with my City Council colleague Kath Scott on a number of hot spot areas. From what residents

have been saying, these hotspots include Queslett Road East, Bakers Lane, Chester Road North and Monmouth Drive, amongst many others. A major issue has arisen at the part of Chester Road North around the junction with Honiley Drive, where there is a school crossing patrol and families cross daily to and from the New Oscott school. Also a lot of elderly people from around the area cross there when walking to the shops on Princess Alice retail park.

We held a site visit last month with the City Highways people and the school crossing manager. As a result, we've now got the City

Highways Engineers to draft a scheme to cut the legal speed limit from 40 to 30mph, and also have tighter enforceable limits at school crossing times.

There will be additional signage and flashing warning signs to alert drivers of this hazardous location. We have set aside the money for this, from our local 'ward works' City Council budget to fund the project in the current financial year

The City Engineers are due to write to residents living in the vicinity of this junction, in the next week or so, with their official proposals. Depending on the mood of responses, we'll be back again later in the autumn to confirm next steps.

While on the subject of that location, we were pleased to have got the City Council's new 'mobile tip trucks' to visit the area around Welshman's Hill recently. This is a new idea, with a 'general

household rubbish' truck and a wide ranging 'recycling truck' [see pic]. The trucks come on a designated day, and it saves residents having to arrange going to the tip (or dumping it as fly tipping) – especially if they don't have their own transport. So if you have extra autumn garden waste to bring along, or large household items that won't fit in the bin (old TVs, ironing boards, chairs, mattresses etc) or anything recyclable (metal, loft clearance, batteries, clothing, carpet etc) this new facility is just the ticket!

It's in a pilot stage at the moment, to test out the scale of public demand. If it proves popular (and the one at Welshman's Hill on 21<sup>st</sup> October certainly was!) then the scheme will be extended more widely. Fly tipping is not as bad in our area as in some of the more inner-city areas, but I'm pleased to say, that our Sutton Vesey Ward is still amongst the areas that has still been included in the scheme, so we are getting our fair shares!






### Sutton Coldfield in the Second World War





I've come to the conclusion that I'm a reasonably intelligent person who does moderately stupid things on a semi regular basis.








FLIRTING WITH DEATH

I was in the 2019 production at Sutton Town Hall of the brilliant production of \*The Addams Family\* with local Sutton-based Manor Musical Theatre Company. Someone was required to spend about eight minutes, the duration of the opening number of the show, in a closed coffin. However, surprisingly, there were no volunteers from any company member, ideally a young lady, which would then enable the coffin to be carried onto the stage more easily.

I stepped forward. Though a mere 12 stone in weight, castors were added to aid the coffin's movement. It was a

genuine lined coffin and I put

a stop on it so that the lid was just opened about an inch or so for my comfort. As a chorus member I was one of the dead ancestors they summoned from the grave or crypt during the opening number. My role was a Victorian gentleman with a frock coat and top hat, not, I hasten to add, as the graphic shown.



Each night, for the week, from the wings I would climb in, lid sealed, and be wheeled on. I had a flip-up top hat clutched to my chest and would put talcum powder on the top of the hat. My cue came from a principal player when told to awaken the dead from the crypt. As my coffin lid was lifted, I would sit up, blow the talc that looked like dust off my hat, stretch a few times and be helped up to join the other ancestors emerging from the crypt to do a macabre dance. This was fine, except when the coffin was not in use and placed in the wings. It became a useful seat for members to sit on. Consequently, as the week wore on the stop on the coffin sunk down, so I was in complete darkness later in the week.

On the final night the backstage crew said, "Eric, we want to take a video clip of you getting into the coffin for the last time." In the semi-gloom I lifted the lid to get in and one of our props ladies, who was in there, sat up. I nearly passed out.

At the end of the show, we had a last night drink and food, and at 11.30pm I was asked if I could take the coffin, with show props, home with me and store in my garage. We put them in the back of my car and there were some garlands of flowers that were placed on the coffin lid.

On arriving home, I realised I would be playing golf early the next morning and it would not look good for members to see a coffin in the back of my car. I envisaged the police



waiting for me after playing golf. The coffin was more cumbersome than heavy, so I decided, at approaching midnight, to struggle and move the coffin into my garage. As I was struggling with it half in and out of the back of the car, our neighbour offered to help me unload and was very surprised to see what it was. I hurriedly explained the situation and hoped he would not peer through his curtains, to see if I was not digging a hole in the back garden.

More mirth was had when the man came to read the gas meter and was surprised to see the coffin, positioned upright and on its end, alongside the meter. I kept a straight face and said it was a bargain on eBay and would come in useful some time in the future for me or my wife.

The event will run from 1-6pm and includes closing Boldmere Road to traffic and a stage for a


variety of acts including Brad Henshaw and band, carols and a variety of

### **Banners Gaters need you!!**



#### Fake ads rife on search engines

Earlier this year, we reported that scammers were running riot on Google and Bing. How? Scammers pose as genuine financial services firms, paying for their ads to appear at the top of search results, and invite people to enter their contact details so that they can call them about bogus investment opportunities.

When we looked at Bing it took seconds to find an ad for a website on the Financial Conduct Authority warning list. And, while Google appears to have stamped out most rogue financial advertisers, unregulated ones are still slipping through. Here's what we found and what Microsoft had to say.

#### Phishing alert: fake McAfee and Norton Antivirus emails

Fake emails are currently circulating posing as McAfee and Norton Antivirus informing people that their subscriptions are at an end and need renewing. The emails ask you to click through on links in order to 'renew the subscriptions'. Some even attempt to trick you into contacting the scammers using the details at the bottom of the email.

### The Online Safety Bill

According to the latest ONS data, adults in the UK are most likely to fall victim to fraud, and with most of us spending more time online over the past year, fraudsters have been able to exploit social media sites and search engines to target victims. The government has committed to including measures to tackle user-generated fraud in the Online Safety Bill, but does this really ensure big tech companies have a legal responsibility to protect consumers from online scams? Here's what we know about what the wider government agenda means for you.

#### Fake supermarket emails

Bogus marketing surveys promising gift cards of up to £100 for filling them out are landing in people's inboxes. These emails impersonate the likes of Asda, Morrisons and Tesco and contain common phishing tactics.

We've got hold of copies, so you know what to watch out for.

### The new 159 anti-fraud hotline Stopping impersonation scams

Stop Scams UK and the Global Cyber Alliance have launched the '159' pilot scheme to disrupt impersonation scammers who pose as banks or other firms to trick customers into sending them money (i.e., bank transfer or authorised push payment scams).

A dedicated phone number for anti-fraud checks could be effective because it allows you to check whether a call from your bank is genuine. But will banks use this to justify even lower reimbursement rates?

Here's how the scheme works.

Our latest investigation has shed new light on the unscrupulous tactics businesses could use to fake their way to glowing feedback.

While many businesses work hard to provide the level of service that leads to genuine five-star reviews, our research shows how others opt to take shortcuts to build their customer ratings.

We set up a fake art business called Patricia's Paintings on both Facebook and Google.

Posing as the owner, we approached several review-selling websites – most of which offer a broad range of fake review 'services' for a range of platforms. Based on their advice, we bought a selection of 93 fake reviews and 500 page 'likes' to publish on our business page.

We found that even with some tech giants such as Facebook having policies to prohibit this kind of harmful activity, it seems easy to bypass their checks.

This is symptomatic of a broader issue – the failure of major online platforms to take enough responsibility, because this allows unscrupulous individuals or businesses and criminals to sell unsafe products, mislead consumers and target potential scam victims.

Our #JustNotBuyingIt campaign demands new laws to protect people from an epidemic of scams, dangerous products and fake reviews online.
