Rob Pocock: MOBILE TIP TRUCKS ARE VISITING BANNERS GATE NEXT WEEK!



As I mentioned in the last Gatepost, the new City Council 'mobile tip and recycling trucks are visiting our Banners Gate neighbourhood in the next few days! Many thanks to all readers who asked for details of the scheme, which I've now sent out by email.

I can now confirm the next 'mobile tip truck' visit to our Sutton Vesey Ward will be on Tuesday, 26th April, operating between the hours of 7am till midday. (See next page for how it looked the last time it came). The City Council Wastes Division have also confirmed the location at the foot of Reay Nadin Drive, B73 6UJ, this is the road leading off Chester Road North going up to the Banners Gate primary school (now called Sutton Park Primary). Please do not dump any items before or after the hours that they will be there – you can get fined!

You can deposit any type of general rubbish, loft / shed / garage clearance waste (but no car parts please), plus bring any extra garden waste, bulky household items, toys, small electrical goods etc for disposal or recycling. Please note, no hazardous

items, fridges or building rubble please.

This new service 'rotates' around our Ward area, visiting every month or two, so each neighbourhood gets a fair 'bite of the cherry'. I'll let you know in a few weeks when and where the next one is coming!

WHAT CAN YOU RECYCLE IN YOUR WHEELIE BIN?

While on my favourite subject of rubbish, people often ask me what kinds of items you can, and cannot, put into your blue recycling bin. To find out, please just click this link to the City Council website. Recycling wheelie bin | What goes in my bins? | Birmingham City Council

So, what dictates which items can and cannot be recycled? It all comes down to the technology used to sort out the individual items, and the waste recycling manufacturing companies that then re-process the items into new materials. The trucks that collect the recycling are divided into two compartments, one for paper / card, and the

other for the rest of the bin.

The contents of your 'paper pod' can include newspapers, wrappers and cardboard packaging, and these all go to a firm called Cappa based in Nechells, where they re-process the high-quality materials into recycled paper, and the lower grade fibres into cardboard and insulation packing material used commercially.

The recyclable items in the bin are taken to an industrial sorting site in Four Ashes over the Staffordshire border, where they are mechanically separated by a factory conveyor belt into the individual materials – steel cans, aluminium cans, glass, and various categories of plastics. These then go to the respective mills and foundries that re-make the materials back into the 'product lines' that re-appear in shops and trade outlets.

The technology for recycling is getting better every year and hopefully that will extend even more things we can all recycle in future. I'll keep you briefed!

The Queen's Jubilee 2022

In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on the 6th February 1952.

Throughout the celebration year Her Majesty and members of the Royal Family will travel around the Country to undertake a variety of engagements to mark this historic occasion.

The focal point of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations will be the Jubilee Weekend in June 2022.

There will be an extended bank holiday from Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June.

This Bank Holiday Weekend will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate this historic milestone.

Later there will be a Platinum Party at Buckingham Palace.

The BBC will produce a live concert to celebrate the most significant and joyous events in the Queen's seventy year reign.

Sunday 5th June The BIG JUBILEE LUNCH

People are invited to share friendship , food and fun with neighbours by holding local street parties.

Lunch can be big or small, with street parties, picnics, tea and cakes, barbeques.

The culmination of the Celebratory Weekend will be a Platinum Jubilee Pageant.

This will feature over 5000 people from across the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth and will be held against the backdrop of Buckingham Palace. The Pageant will feature Street Art/ Theatre / Circus/Carnival and costume.

Neighbourhood Action Co-ordinators

Birmingham City Council's Neighbourhoods Division- NDSU is looking for 10 Neighbourhood Action Co-ordinators as part of a new programme of work seeking to develop new ways of working with the residents, community groups and local partners such as the police. The work will focus on 20 areas of the city with the highest concentration of local environmental/ neighbourhood issues. The focus will be on partnership development and community capacity building to tackle neighbourhood priorities such as street scene and community safety issues as set out in ward plans etc.

The role will require the successful candidates to work closely with the police, ward councillors, residents and relevant stakeholders to link together groups, task council services and develop constructive solutions to the presenting issues. A small grants pot will also be available to support groups in developing ongoing solutions.

You will need the ability to engage with a wide variety of people and be action orientated.

The roles will initially be for a fixed 12 month period, however if the scheme delivers successful outcomes and future years budgets are confirmed there will be an option to make the roles permanent.

You will be required to develop, plan, organise and manage service responses, community activities, programme initiatives and ensure active participation of residents/communities. This will involve close working with the police and developing a neighbourhood tasking approach. You will need to negotiate and liaise with elected members, neighbourhoods forums, committees and voluntary groups to ensure all stakeholders have an input into the events/activities within their area.

You will write reports, action plans and strategies as well as identify and apply for external funding and support residents with grant applications.

You will be committed to motivate, support and influence at all levels through positive relationship building both internally and externally with neighbourhood and community groups to enable Birmingham's neighbourhoods to be thriving, optimistic and resilient.

You will have project development, co-ordination and management skills and have the ability to activate multi agency and community responses to priorities.

An understanding of community work, community safety and street scene issues is desirable. You will have an understanding of equal opportunities in practice and the community cohesion agenda.

You will be able to promote and develop governance arrangements at a local level and be able to communicate and negotiate with a wide variety of people.

You will have the ability to manage small budgets with the pilot having a £10k grant pot per area, as well as be able to draw up and deliver reports/presentations to local audiences.

You must be able to create and maintain effective working relationships with a wide range of stakeholders including elected members and senior officers. You will be able to plan and elevate work carried out.

Commonwealth Games Update

In the last issue of Gate Post, I reported (correctly at the time) that the Familiarisation session 1 would be on Wednesday 27th July. This has since changed to Thursday 28th July.

As you will see from the graphic, the Triathlon takes place on Friday 29th July and Sunday 31st July. The triathletes will also be out cycling the route for familiarisation on Thursday 28th July and Saturday 30th July early in the morning.

There will be 2,000 ticketed spectators at Boldmere Gate on each of the Triathlon days and an estimated 20-30,000 non-ticketed spectators, most of whom will be around the cycling route.

We now know that the events will start at 11am and that the 'field of play' roads (those which the cyclists will be using) will be fully closed from 9am which means even permit holders won't be able to gain access from this time. All roads due to be closed (see last Gatepost) will be closed from 6am on each event day. The roads will re-open at the end of each day and during Saturday 30th July. 'No stopping' restrictions will be implemented from 6pm on the evening before each event day (Thursday 28th July and Saturday 31st July) and any vehicles remaining at 3am on the event day will be towed away. Streets will also be cleaned overnight.

Flying the Flag for Boldmere Project

We have now started to promote our Flying the Flag for Boldmere Project which is going to be a trail of flags around the Boldmere area. This will incorporate 54 small hard-wearing flags of the Commonwealth on lampposts together with a full-sized flag in the heart of Boldmere and a commemorative plaque at Boldmere Gate in Sutton Park.

We would like to welcome residents and local organisations to adopt a flag. This simply means nominating a lamppost for the flag and promising to check and clean it twice a year and report any faults to us. There is no cost involved and the flags will be installed professionally. This is your chance to 'own' a small part of Boldmere's history. The lamppost (or other proposal if you wish to make one) does not need to be outside your house, in fact it's best if it's not near residential properties as it may upset your neighbours. Examples of good locations are a lamppost by a fence on the corner of a road, a lamppost by a park, a lamppost by a bus stop etc. We welcome adoptions from Banners Gate and New Oscott for those who have a connection with Boldmere. We are also progressing with the plans for cross-street banners across Boldmere Road, but as you can imagine, negotiations with landlords and Birmingham City Council take time.

Ten acres of tree-planting at Manorial Wood in Sutton Coldfield



Trustees from <u>Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust</u> have started the next phase of their progressive plans, to replant English deciduous broadleaved trees at Manorial Woods.

Keith Dudley, Tina Swani and Jane Mosson joined the planting of more than 4,000 trees at the site, assisted by children from Little Sutton Primary School, following the recently harvested Corsican Pine.

The entire site is due to be restocked with 4,500 trees of both UK-grown hardwoods and an intimate mix of conifers to aid the establishment of the crop. The next phase of planting will take place in May, ahead of the Queen's Jubilee celebrations, where a central feature Yew Tree will be planted.

The Trust will enlist the help of local schools again later in the year to help with a further phase of planting in the autumn. This aims to engage the local community in a project that will benefit Sutton Coldfield for generations to come.

Tina Swani, Chief Executive of Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust, said: "It's hugely rewarding to see our long-held plans come to fruition at Manorial Wood, which will support a greater mix of woodland plants and wildlife. The previous Corsican Pine trees were in dire need of harvesting and replanting, due to the stock reaching its potential, lack of undergrowth and ongoing fire risk."

"We are delighted that Little Sutton Primary School is involved, the woods are big part of the environment of Sutton and what a way to get the next generation involved in helping to improve the future of the town."

Rachel Davis, headteacher at Little Sutton Primary School, said: "We are very excited about being part of a project to plant 4,500 trees that will create a broad-leaved, biodiverse woodland to benefit generations to come.

"At Little Sutton we feel it is really important to prepare our pupils to be good citizens, so we work hard to instil positive values and opportunities for them to make an impact in our community. Our pupils are passionate about playing their part in making the world a better place, and this fantastic project will enable them to do this by looking after the local environment."

An environmentally sustainable approach is being taken at Manorial Wood that includes biodegradable tree protectors being used, instead of plastic, to prevent damage from small animals as the trees become established.



Our green waste bins are not being collected, they should have been collected on the 7 March 22 and they were missed, then on 4 April 22 when they were missed again. When I received the email above, I asked Cllr. Rob Pocock, our city councillor, if he could comment on the situation. He suggested it could be covid absences through illness and isolation and sent me the following from Cllr, John O'Shea, Cabinet Member for Street Scene and Parks.

Subject: Refuse Collections

Hi all.

I know that residents across the city have been reporting missed collections and I wanted to explain the pressures that we are working under.

We cover staff absence through the use of agency HGV drivers and we are currently about 14 drivers short of the numbers that we need, as the agency is struggling to recruit them. As you will be aware, there is still a national shortage of HGV drivers, which has affected businesses and local authorities across the country and continues to be an issue.

We have increased the rate that we pay the agency drivers and the agency is more hopeful of finding people to fill the requirement. Beyond that, we are working to put over 30 current employees through the driver training process, but this is not a quick fix, as the training and testing process will take some time.

In the interim, we have been sending crews over from other depots and providing additional cover at weekends to clear backlogs. I would advise that if residents have had their collections missed, then they should leave their bins out and the collection should be made the following day or on the Saturday. Every effort will also be made to avoid the situation where a round is dropped twice in a row and the depot managers have been briefed to do all that they can to avoid this.

Again, I'm sorry that this is affecting our residents. We are doing all we can to find additional drivers, but it is likely to remain challenging for a while.

Shakespeare in Sutton - FOLIO's fun festival for all

Shakespeare in Sutton - FOLIO's fun festival for all Sutton Coldfield residents will get a rare opportunity to see a world treasure, first-hand and on their doorstep as part of a special arts festival in April 2022: FOLIO Sutton Coldfield will be hosting an event in Sutton Coldfield Library to see an original Shakespeare First Folio, and one that belongs to the people of Birmingham, the first collected works of William Shakespeare, published 399 years ago. Appropriately, this takes place on the Bard's birthday, April 23!

This is just one of more than 20 events in 9 different venues around the town across April as part of Shakespeare in Sutton, FOLIO's fun festival for all (https://shakespeareinsutton.org.uk/). With film showings and the chance to meet Falstaff, music performances and a newly commissioned map of Sutton in the time of Shakespeare, spoken word and street theatre, community group collaborations, costumes, competitions, local history events and online literature talks there really is something for everyone.

Booking is now open for all events and activities (9 -30 April) which require booking (some events are drop-in). Over 400 free tickets for different events were booked in the first weekend after publishing the full programme.

Shakespeare's First Folio is being displayed thanks to FOLIO's collaboration with the 'Everything to Everybody' Project, an ambitious celebration of one of the UK's most important cultural assets: the vast Shakespeare Memorial Library housed within the Library of Birmingham.

Birmingham's copy of the First Folio is unique because it is the only one bought with the aim of improving people's lives through culture and education. It was purchased in 1881 for all the people of Birmingham - no matter their background, wealth or occupation and with the First Folio Tour the

Everything to Everybody project wants to take this resource to as many people as possible. The First Folio's first outing is to Sutton Coldfield Library. It is then touring across Birmingham over the next two years with stops at a range of locations including the Black Country Living Museum, Sense Touchbase Pears, Selly Manor, Highbury Hall, Gap Arts and The Hive in the Jewellery Quarter. The Folio will visit more locations in 2023.

In order to ensure as many people as possible can view the Folio, which will be open on the page of Henry IV part 1 which mentions Sutton Coldfield, people are advised to book a timed slot to visit Sutton Coldfield Library on April 23. That day will also see historical dance and music performances, a family puppet making session, a display of costumes from the Royal Shakespeare Company and other activities suitable for all ages to have fun with Shakespeare.

The streets of Sutton will also be coming to life on April 23 with walking performances, full of surprises, of the specially commission 'Shakespeare Undone' but the Natural Theatre Company.

FOLIO's festival kicks off on April 9 with creative writing and spoken word performance workshops in Sutton Coldfield Library, with participants able to take open mic slots at Mouthpieces, a spoken word special in Highbury Theatre, on April 29, with headliners including Jemima Hughes and Dreadlock Alien.

A brand new map of Sutton in the time of Shakespeare by Sutton Coldfield born children's book illustrator John Shelley will be on display in the Gracechurch Centre, whilst local expert Dr Mike Hodder will give a talk (Holy Trinity Church, April 20) and a guided walk (meeting at Vesey Gardens, April 30) on the same topic.

Shakespeare experts Dr Simon May and Ella May McGrail will be giving online talks about different aspects of the plays of the greatest writer in English. Local theatre groups The Highbury Players and Raw Talent Youth Theatre will be performing their own takes on the bard. Sutton Coldfield Movie Maker's brand new feature film, Falstaff - a Naughty Knight in Sutton Coldfield - will receive its premier during the festival.

Liz Parry, FOLIO Trustee, said: ""Although the main focus is Sutton library, one of the lovely things about the festival is that events are happening in several different places, giving people an opportunity to see parts of our town that they may not have visited before."

Jenny Wilkinson, FOLIO Trustee said: "I am particularly excited by the wide range of different activities we have on offer - written and spoken word, art, music, dance, drama. There really is something for everyone."

Noran FLynn, FOLIO Trustee said: "The Shakespeare festival is bringing a range of exciting activities to Sutton Coldfield that will be accessible to everyone. It is amazing to think our town featured in Shakespeare's writings and that we are now celebrating that in 2022!"
