

Rob Pocock: MORE CASH FOR PARK POOLS **INVESTMENT**

The City Council have announced another new £280,000 restoration project for Sutton Park. This time it's for

environment improvement works around the park's historic Pools. There are six pools across the Park, originally man-made, created by dams being built several hundred years ago for largely industrial reasons (fish ponds, milling, grinding of iron implement etc). For example, Longmoor Pool was built in 1735 to power an industrial-scale watermill at the site, which was used in the manufacture of buttons!

The restoration fund will be used to upgrade the infrastructure of the ponds – including improved sluices, dam protection, brickwork surrounds, and bank erosion. This is not exactly glamorous work, but it is essential in the long-term maintenance of the Park's historic landscape. Often in life it is the invisible stuff that goes on behind the scenes, that does not grab headlines but we all depend on it.

'TIP TRUCK' TRIUMPH!

Many thanks for all Banners Gate and Parklands residents who brought rubbish and recycling to the City Council 'mobile tip truck' visit to Reay Nadin Drive last month. They collected a full truck load - 10

tonnes – in the morning visit! I went to see the crew as they were finishing their shift and they were full of praise for the courteous way residents had approached the service, sticking to the rules on what to bring and making sure nothing was dumped before or after the visit. They told me this is not always the case in other parts of the City they visit, so a big thank-you to our great neighbourhood – you have done us proud! By the same token, a lot of residents contacted me to congratulate the cheerful helpfulness of the crewmen. They often offered to take stuff out of people's car boots etc so people did not even have to get out of their cars!

The mobile waste and recycling trucks are a new idea that's proving very popular. The next one is due to return again to Welshman's Hill, as they did on their first visit here last autumn, probably later in June. Max Hatton: Questions I've been asked.

What is your backstory?

Hello, I'm Max Hatton your new Labour Councillor for Sutton Vesey Ward! I have

lived in the Sutton Vesey ward all my life apart from 4 years away at university. I attended New Oscott Primary and the Streetly School and sixth form, both excellent schools with great teachers! I went on to study American Studies at Swansea University with a year abroad at San Francisco State University, my time away really shaped me as a person. After graduating I thought of no other place to return than my hometown. My family and friends are here and it's truly a great place to live.

I've had a few jobs around the Sutton Vesey ward, my very first job was delivering the Sutton Coldfield News at the age of 15. At age 17 I had my first part time job at Halls Garden Centre working in the Aquatics Centre, I loved working at Halls especially in the summer! After returning from university I spent some time working in the kitchens and behind the bar of the Sutton Park Hotel, another fun place to work!

In the last few years I've worked for Legal and General in the sales and customer services departments, and at present I'm a Candidate Support Coordinator for the RICS helping our future surveyors.

What made you decide to run for Councillor?

I've been passionate about politics for most of my life. I remember the election of '97 and having the day off school as New Oscott Primary was used as a polling station (the same polling station I've recently used to vote for myself!), and I remember how excited my parents were to have a Labour government back in power. From that day I understood the importance of politics and how having a caring government impacts people's standards of living. Growing up, at times, my family relied on the state to help with our living costs, that same level of support is not available to families nowadays.

Recently I've helped deliver the Community Action newsletter since 2020 but I've always wanted to do more to support the local community; there are some excellent community lead groups around Sutton Vesey to get involved with, as Councillor I want to highlight the great work these groups are doing. Rob, Kath and Manish are an excellent team to join and I'm very eager to help our local Labour team make Sutton Vesey a truly special place to live.

What do you love about Sutton Vesey?

What's not to love? As somebody who doesn't drive I like having easy access to public transport. With our bus and train links we have numerous destinations to visit. I can catch a train from Wylde Green station and after a few changes end up in sunny Barmouth!

We also have great parking facilities around New Oscott and Sutton so shopping local becomes less of a task than shopping in Birmingham.

I love the history of our area; we have the ancient roman road of Icknield Street on our doorstep in the beautiful Sutton Park. Even the Romans knew Sutton Vesey was a great place to be! I've spent many days of my childhood in Sutton Park, not many other communities in the city have access to their own piece of wilderness where you can spend the morning walking through ancient woodlands and then go shopping on your way home.

Queen Elizabeth was crowned on 2 June 1953 in Westminster Abbey, the setting for every Coronation since 1066, using words which descend directly from those used at the Coronation of King Edgar in 973. There were 8,251 guests waiting to welcome her into the Abbey, representing 129 nations and territories. 27 million people in the UK watched the ceremony on television and 11 million listened on the radio. My Nan once described it to me as 'a bit of a do' which always makes me smile – A 'bit of a do' indeed!

Something that is often forgotten is that Elizabeth II was not born to be Queen, neither would she have expected to be crowned at the age of 27 as her father was just 56 when he died. Whatever your opinion of the Royal Family, there is no doubt that The Queen has been a fixed-point in our recent history, a constant during periods of huge upheaval and change. She has always considered her role to be one of service and has continually acknowledged that it is a role could not be done alone.

When I spoke to you last... I asked you all, whatever your religion, to pray for me on the day of my Coronation - to pray that God would give me wisdom and strength to carry out the promises that I should then be making... I have been uplifted and sustained by the knowledge that your thoughts and prayers were with me.

I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning, I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God. Like others of you who draw inspiration from your own faith, I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel.

The Queen's Jubilee 2022

In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on the 6th February 1952.

Throughout the celebration year Her Majesty and members of the Royal Family will travel around the Country to undertake a variety of engagements to mark this historic occasion.

The focal point of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations will be the Jubilee Weekend in June 2022.

There will be an extended bank holiday from Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June.

This Bank Holiday Weekend will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate this historic milestone.

But briefly the arrangements are as follows;

Thursday 2nd June

The Queen's Birthday Parade - **Trooping the Colour.** 1400 Soldiers, 200 Horses and 400 Musicians will parade from Buckingham Palace along the Mall to Horse Guards Parade.

There will be a number of Jubilee Beacons lit across the Country as well as in the Capital Cities of Commonwealth Countries.

Friday 3rd June

There will be a Service of Thanksgiving in St Pauls Cathedral.

Saturday 4th June

The Queen will attend the Derby at Epsom Downs.

Later there will be a Platinum Party at Buckingham Palace.

The BBC will produce a live concert to celebrate the most significant and joyous events in the Queen's seventy year reign.

Sunday 5th June The BIG JUBILEE LUNCH

People are invited to share friendship, food and fun with neighbours by holding local street parties.

Lunch can be big or small, with street parties, picnics, tea and cakes, barbeques.

The culmination of the Celebratory Weekend will be a Platinum Jubilee Pageant.

This will feature over 5000 people from across the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth and will be held against the backdrop of Buckingham Palace. The Pageant will feature Street Art/ Theatre / Circus/Carnival and costume.

I hope everyone in our Royal Town will get involved and start planning now for this wonderful occasion.

Why have I done it?



Neighbourhood Action Co-ordinators

Birmingham City Council's Neighbourhoods Division- NDSU is looking for 10 Neighbourhood Action Co-ordinators as part of a new programme of work seeking to develop new ways of working with the residents, community groups and local partners such as the police. The work will focus on 20 areas of the city with the highest concentration of local environmental/ neighbourhood issues. The focus will be on partnership development and community capacity building to tackle neighbourhood priorities such as street scene and community safety issues as set out in ward plans etc.

The role will require the successful candidates to work closely with the police, ward councillors, residents and relevant stakeholders to link together groups, task council services and develop constructive solutions to the presenting issues. A small grants pot will also be available to support groups in developing ongoing solutions.

You will need the ability to engage with a wide variety of people and be action orientated.

The roles will initially be for a fixed 12 month period, however if the scheme delivers successful outcomes and future years budgets are confirmed there will be an option to make the roles permanent.

You will be required to develop, plan, organise and manage service responses, community activities, programme initiatives and ensure active participation of residents/communities. This will involve close working with the police and developing a neighbourhood tasking approach. You will need to negotiate and liaise with elected members, neighbourhoods forums, committees and voluntary groups to ensure all stakeholders have an input into the events/activities within their area.

You will write reports, action plans and strategies as well as identify and apply for external funding and support residents with grant applications.

You will be committed to motivate, support and influence at all levels through positive relationship building both internally and externally with neighbourhood and community groups to enable Birmingham's neighbourhoods to be thriving, optimistic and resilient.

You will have project development, co-ordination and management skills and have the ability to activate multi agency and community responses to priorities.

An understanding of community work, community safety and street scene issues is desirable. You will have an understanding of equal opportunities in practice and the community cohesion agenda.

You will be able to promote and develop governance arrangements at a local level and be able to communicate and negotiate with a wide variety of people.

You will have the ability to manage small budgets with the pilot having a £10k grant pot per area, as well as be able to draw up and deliver reports/presentations to local audiences.

You must be able to create and maintain effective working relationships with a wide range of stakeholders including elected members and senior officers. You will be able to plan and elevate work carried out.

Commonwealth Games Update

In the last issue of Gate Post, I reported (correctly at the time) that the Familiarisation session 1 would be on Wednesday 27th July. This has since changed to Thursday 28th July.

As you will see from the graphic, the Triathlon takes place on Friday 29th July and Sunday 31st July. The triathletes will also be out cycling the route for familiarisation on Thursday 28th July and Saturday 30th July early in the morning.

There will be 2,000 ticketed spectators at Boldmere Gate on each of the Triathlon days and an estimated 20-30,000 non-ticketed spectators, most of whom will be around the cycling route.

We now know that the events will start at 11am and that the 'field of play' roads (those which the cyclists will be using) will be fully closed from 9am which means even permit holders won't be able to gain access from this time. All roads due to be closed (see last Gatepost) will be closed from 6am on each event day. The roads will re-open at the end of each day and during Saturday 30th July. 'No stopping' restrictions will be implemented from 6pm on the evening before each event day (Thursday 28th July and Saturday 31st July) and any vehicles remaining at 3am on the event day will be towed away. Streets will also be cleaned overnight.

Flying the Flag for Boldmere Project

We have now started to promote our Flying the Flag for Boldmere Project which is going to be a trail of flags around the Boldmere area. This will incorporate 54 small hard-wearing flags of the Commonwealth on lampposts together with a full-sized flag in the heart of Boldmere and a commemorative plaque at Boldmere Gate in Sutton Park.

We would like to welcome residents and local organisations to adopt a flag. This simply means nominating a lamppost for the flag and promising to check and clean it twice a year and report any faults to us. There is no cost involved and the flags will be installed professionally. This is your chance to 'own' a small part of Boldmere's history. The lamppost (or other proposal if you wish to make one) does not need to be outside your house, in fact it's best if it's not near residential properties as it may upset your neighbours. Examples of good locations are a lamppost by a fence on the corner of a road, a lamppost by a park, a lamppost by a bus stop etc. We welcome adoptions from Banners Gate and New Oscott for those who have a connection with Boldmere. We are also progressing with the plans for cross-street banners across Boldmere Road, but as you can imagine, negotiations with landlords and Birmingham City Council take time.



Trust reveals plans for Sutton Coldfield thanks to grant approvals Sutton Coldfield Charitab

<u>Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust</u>, which strives to improve the quality of life in Sutton Coldfield, has announced that eight beneficiaries will receive grants from the Trust this month.

The Trust, which has been in existence for almost 500 years, offers a range of grant programmes to benefit the area and its residents – with a total of £133,490 being awarded to Sutton Coldfield Grammar Schools for Girls, Walmley Tennis Club, Walmley Junior School, Salus Fatigue Foundation, Harvest Fields Community Centre, Town Junior School, Memory Café in Walmley and Sutton Coldfield Acoustic Guitar Club.

The funds will help towards a number of initiatives such as improving playing courts, equipment and venue hire space, as well as a 'Daily Mile' track creation for Town Junior School and funding local support for Salus Fatigue Foundation, to help sufferers of Chronic Fatigue Syndrome.

Over the past few years, the Trust has granted well over £1,000,000 in grants to organisations and individuals across Sutton Coldfield, with plans to continue making vital improvements and helping those in need, in the area.


was finally installed in our dining room, a constant reminder of an eventful visit to Venice.

Local Rotarians have joined forces with a Birmingham charity to help the homeless get back on their feet again – quite literally.

The Rotary Club of Erdington is working with Have A Hart, Help The Homeless to provide chiropody, headed up by Coventry Podiatrist Gary Dancer and NHS footcare assistant Tracey Launchbury from Erdington.

The volunteer team provide nail cutting, hard skin removal and general care and advice as well as handing out free socks at their city centre base in Temple Row. Now they're appealing to the public for more socks donations.



Gary Dancer, who runs Gary Dancer Chiropody, said: "I have done clinics for the homeless for years, often with the Salvation Armv. I asked the charity whether this was something that they'd like to introduce as part of their outreach program. They were very enthusiastic and the club wanted to

support it.

"We have partnered with Have a Hart because we have supported their work for a long time. We know that they are a trusted organisation that share our values as Rotarians.

"We provide a basic Chiropody service such as nail cutting, hard skin removal and general care and advice - although we have also needed to provide first aid a couple of times, such as getting glass out of one person's foot. Everyone we treat gets a pair of socks before they go."

He added: "The simple fact is that homeless people have many problems with their feet because of poor shoes and often wet feet for days at a time. This can be very dangerous because it can lead to ulcers and other conditions. The other problem is undiagnosed diabetes combined with drug and alcohol abuse can be lethal. I can detect and give advice about this which hopefully saves big problems later on."

Have A Hart is a non-profit outreach service run by volunteers and takes place at the rear of House of Fraser between 6-9pm on the last Saturday of the month.







How to block nuisance calls

The scourge of cold-calling scammers are forever doing the rounds - either interrupting our evenings or causing us anxiety so we don't even want to pick up the phone. However, there is good news, most of the major landline phone providers now offer a free service to reduce the number of nuisance calls that you receive.

In this guide, we'll look at how they work and what your options are.

Push payment scams

When a large sum of unsolicited money appeared in Oscar's account, alarm bells started ringing. The money had come from a family member, but they did not make the transfer. After piecing together what happened, they believed scammers had gained access to the family member's account, then selected an existing payee to transfer money out to. Their goal was for Oscar to follow instructions to send it on to the fraudster's own account.

Here's how the scam worked and how you can stop it.
