



What a September this has been! If there is one thing this country of ours is good at it is putting on a display. I thought the Olympics and the Jubilee were good but they both paled into insignificance compared with the funeral of a Queen that most people have known since birth.

### **Rob Pocock: BINS BLITZ**

As readers will be aware, I've been



challenging the City Council to improve the reliability of the bin collection service for some while. The Monday collections in Banners Gate, New Oscott and Parklands have been particularly hard hit by

missed bin collections in recent years.

My 'big mouth' has now got me the reward I guess I deserve! I've been officially appointed by the City Council leader to head up an Independent internal Inquiry into the cause of the problems. This gives me the right to go 'ferreting about' getting the 'inside story' of what's been causing all the trouble for so long.

A reliable bin collection service is a basic civic right for all residents. For some people it's actually the main thing they get from their taxes. And I don't want to go finger-pointing at the crews themselves. We have to give credit to our bin crews – it's as tough a job as there is, getting up at 4am and being on the streets in the worst of the icy winter weather, and in the sweltering heat of summer. I personally witnessed crewmen, dressed head to foot in heavy protective clothing, out in the height of the recent summer morning heatwave collecting bins – at over 100 degrees Fahrenheit.

But in the end, there is no excuse for the missed collections. Crew shortages, missing drivers, faulty vehicles, poor labour relations – these excuses have to stop. I will leave no stone unturned in an effort to get to the root of the problems, and my Inquiry will set firm proposals for putting things right. It will then

be down to the Council leadership to take the decisions to implement the proposals, and I very much hope they do.

## NEW SUTTON PARK BOLDMERE GATE CAR PARK – OPENING SOON!

The final conversion of the Sutton Park Boldmere Gate car park is now under way. The car park will be finally converted for public use and opened to the public, soon in the autumn once the work is completed on the final adaptations. It was constructed with various features specific to the Commonwealth Games usage, e.g., power and utilities surface connections and base plates which need to be capped out and made safe before being open to general access.

In addition, there are going to be some extra 'legacy works' as part of the autumn restoration to make the area round the Gate safer – new speed humps, signage, and pedestrian crossing areas will be installed. It has been a long wait – but the end to the dreaded previous 'pothole paradise' is now in sight.

Annual Community Conference – Sutton Vesey Public Meeting Sat 1st October, 2.30pm – this is our next official City Council Ward Forum meeting, agenda attached. It's in the form of an Annual Community Conference, where all residents across the Ward area can come together and raise improvements needed in our neighbourhoods. There will be displays and updates from community groups, and a round-table 'workshop' session where residents work together to develop ideas jointly. The ideas raised at the meeting will then be considered for inclusion in our official Ward Action Plan that eventually gets approved by the City Council, and (hopefully!) implemented over the next four-year period 2022-26. It's being held at the Newman Centre (former Carpenters Arms) off Boldmere shopping street. Please come – it promises to be a lively and interesting event!

Launch of new Sutton Park Boldmere Gate Car Park. You'll be aware that this car park has been re-built out of the previous 'pothole paradise' using money from the Commonwealth Games, as it was used as a base for the successful Triathlon event. People have asked us, why is it not open to the general public yet? Well, it will be soon, but the reason for the delay is to allow it to be finally converted for general public use. It was originally constructed with a number of features specific to the CWG use, e.g., power and utilities surface connections and base plates that need to be capped off and made safe prior to general public use. There are also a number of additional 'legacy 'improvements to be added. These include three new speed humps at the entrance to the Park, Electric Vehicle charging points and disabled bays in the car park, a new virtual cattle grid, new signage to warn drivers of the advisory 5mph speed limit, and better signed and marked pedestrian walkways at the entrance. Contractors are about to start work on these final conversions, and then it will be open to the public at long last.

However, it wasn't long before I was receiving updates from friends about the progress that they had made as they stood in line, and of the conversations that they were having with strangers as they slowly moved on the journey to Westminster Hall. All of it to say thank you to someone they had never met, but who had been a part of their lives for so long.

And as the ten days of mourning unfolded, we were told again and again that the old order had ended, that everything had changed.

Which makes this week feel especially strange – because in many ways much has stayed the same.

One of the ways we do that is to encourage people to get together, and on the last Friday of each month we hold a Coffee Morning at 10.30am, to which you are all invited. 

I have received a communiqué from abroad, Wales to be exact. Residents of Banners Gate, especially Westwood Road and the congregation of St. Columba's Church, will remember David Fleming. If you have not heard of his whereabouts, please read on, produced on his new laptop, so I am reliably informed.



Hi Tony,

After a fall in the garden, I found it difficult to cope with the house & garden and painful to climb stairs. For some time, my daughter has suggested I go and live with them at their bungalow in mid-Wales, Llandrindod Wells, an undertaking of swings and roundabouts.

I lived in Westwood Rd for over 60 years, so I left all my neighbours and friends from St Columbus behind, but here it is very quiet, the air is fresh and the country scenery is wonderful and green, and lots of sheep - lots and lots - and lots. The roads are very smooth, and empty. 3 or 4 cars in half a mile is a traffic jam.

Although Llandrindod is the County Town of Powys it's quite spread out and (to me) more like a large village with the shops in two or three narrow streets. There is a cottage hospital, but anything

serious is sent to Hereford, Swansea or Cardiff.

The photo is taken from my bedroom window of Elan Valley, due west towards Aberystwyth, 42 miles away. Due West, so we get some



magnificent sunsets, and Aberystwyth University has a society devoted to watching the sunsets.

There are a lot of garden centres around, useful for a coffee or snack, and as you can see, I've bought a scooter to get around. So, you see, swings and roundabouts.

## Disabled people's right to escape from fire



Sarah Rennie and Georgie Hulme is organizing this fundraiser.

In support of disabled people's right to escape their flat in a fire, and in the fight for justice for those who died in Grenfell Tower, please help us hold the Government to account so that it takes fire safety seriously for everyone.

In 2017, 72 people died in the Grenfell Tower fire. A significant proportion were disabled people, along with their relatives who refused to leave them. No disabled or vulnerable person living there had an evacuation plan.

The Grenfell Tower Inquiry recommended that all disabled people living in high-rise buildings should have the right to a personal emergency evacuation plan ("an evacuation plan"). The Prime Minister promised to implement all of the Inquiry's recommendations in full.

Five years on and the Home Office has announced that it will not give disabled people the right to evacuation plans - on the basis of "practicality, cost and proportionality." We believe the Government must be held to account for failing to make the fundamental changes it promised in the wake of the Grenfell Tower fire. We have therefore instructed our legal team to issue proceedings to seek permission for a Judicial Review.

Our lawyers are acting on a 'no win no fee' basis and, although we hope our legal challenge will be successful, the Home Office could seek their legal costs against us if we lose. We cannot afford these as what's left of our savings has been set aside for the £000s we must pay for remediation of our flats.

## Eric's another holiday adventure



Some years ago, a friend asked me if we would like to join him and his family on a Villa holiday in northern Spain. It was a really nervy adventure because we were travelling through France and down into Spain, him towing the family caravan and me towing his small cabin cruiser with my company car.

The plan was to spend a couple of nights getting there and back home, his family sleeping in the van and my wife and me in his small, cabined boat. Each night on the camp sites it was a struggle for my wife and I to clamber into the boat. Being the last in I handed the bucket up, much to her embarrassment, as there was no loo in the boat. On finally arriving in Spain after a long day and getting split up occasionally in the larger towns we arrived at our destination. My wife was not amused when my friend apologised as he had left the key to the villa at home. However, he recalled the owners saying it was a circular shaped villa, on looking around most of them were. We parked up while he and family drove off to try and locate site agents who would know the property and that's another story. My wife said, "If they don't come back by dusk, we are stopping in the nearest hotel." So not a good start to the holiday.

We eventually got to the villa and on the first night slept on a most uncomfortable put-you-up bed deciding their caravan would be more comfortable. The good idea was spoilt by the August heat in the van and constant mosquitoes. To make matters worse, due to the high level of villa building in the area, there was water rationing and we had to stockpile water and use the swimming pool water for the loo. The boat we had hoped to use was another disaster, my friend and I took it out for a trial run and the engine failed so we had to paddle back to shore. As the cost of the engine repair was too high, it was only used as accommodation on the return trip. The disaster gets higher on the Richter scale by me delaying the cross-channel ferry departure time by 30 minutes. I had a carnet document to prove the purchase of the boat's outboard engine in the UK, (before we joined the EU) This I was to get stamped at every country checkpoint in both directions, but no one had

stamped it going out they just waived me through. We boarded the boat and settled down in the lounge and an announcement was made, "Would the owner of the registration numbered car please report to the purser's office ASAP?" I blanched as it was me and the French customs were delaying the ferry sailing until my carnet was stamped. I had to hop into a car and be swiftly ferried down the dock, push in front of burly truck drivers for my stamp. No sympathy from my friend who said, "The next announcement will be from the Captain for you to walk the plank."



Footnote: My how things change I bet the French customs still rigorously check all boat engines' validity!!!







StreetWatch has been kept really simple, it is about going for a walk with your neighbours, getting to know people in the area and building up a sense of community spirit.

We ask for a minimum of 2 hours a month but you can do as much as you like.

The whole point of StreetWatch is about being that visible presence to DETER crime and anti-social behaviour, NOT deal with it-that's our job. If you see something that needs to be dealt with, call us.

All members are vetted and trained; the training is very simple and just involves making sure that people are aware of what we are asking of them, this takes approx. 1 hour. After training we register members on the forum which enables you to communicate with us.

We go with you on your first 2 walks to check you are confident and know what you are doing and then you go out independently.

There must be 2 people on each walk for safety and you are given a high visibility jacket with "StreetWatch" on it so people know you are part of an organised group. After that you organise your own walks, go where you want to, for how long you want, when you want!


At the training people usually swap phone numbers and set up chat groups such as WhatsApp to organise the walks - all very simple and low key, you can even walk your dog at the same time if you have one.



## Do Not Watch Street Harassment In Silence

#### ARE YOU OKAY?

Street harassment is on the rise and is often not an isolated incident. We know the long-term impact can harm mental health and change people's behaviour. Victims often feel guilty, ashamed, and blame themselves.

Witnessing street harassment and not safely intervening sends the message to those experiencing it that it's okay and society normalises it. Ongoing acceptance of street harassment contributes to a toxic culture. We want to change this, but we need your help.



Today we are launching a campaign that targets **bystanders** (those who witness street harassment), be those Neighbourhood Watch members or not.

The campaign encourages those who see someone being harassed in public to ask the victim if they are okay when they feel safe doing so. Those three little words let them know that they stand by them and that street harassment is never okay.

This simple action is a delay technique and part of the 5Ds of bystander intervention developed by Right to Be. By asking, 'Are you okay?' we become active bystanders and send the message that harassment is not okay. There are further actions that people can take, but our campaign focuses on the simplest step everyone can take.' Deborah Waller, Head of Communications and Digital, Neighbourhood Watch Network



Sutton Coldfield Trinity Quilters was founded in 1996, our aims are to further the skill and art of patchwork and quilting. We meet at Holy Trinity Parish Church, Mill Street twice per month: the second Tuesday evening from 7.30-9.30 pm and the fourth Wednesday afternoon from 2.30-4.30 pm. Our new programme commences on Tuesday 13 September 2022 with a talk about miniature quilting.

**ABOUT OUR MEETINGS:** Our meetings are varied: we have leading quilters who give talks, demonstrations and workshops in their particular specialism, as well as sit and sew meetings, social evenings, demonstrations, as well as a Christmas Party and Show and Tell evening. In this year's programme we have a number of speakers: one will be speaking about the small quilt kits she designs (there will also be a pop up shop!) another is taking us on her Japanese Journey of quilting and many others. We also have two trips a year, one to the Malvern Quilt Show in May and another to a quilting outlet for retail therapy (different each year).

**WHO CAN JOIN?** Anyone who is interested in patchwork and quilting - you don't need to be an expert! We positively welcome beginners to the craft and members are more than willing to share their knowledge. In addition, one of our members is a qualified P&Q teacher and runs workshops and classes in and around Sutton Coldfield.

WHAT KIND OF THINGS DO YOU MAKE? Quilts aren't just things you put on beds: we make bags, cushions, even clothing! Quilts can be "traditional" or modern, contemporary, illusions, memory quilts, pictures, etc. If you are a complete beginner, start by making a bag or small cushion or cot quilt. Many members also make quilts for Linus UK, a charity which gives quilts to children and young people in hospital, hospice or in need. Whilst we do not "make" things at meetings, we have demonstrations and workshops and some sit and sew sessions.

**HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?** Members pay an annual subscription of £20, due in September or £10 from January, plus £4 for each meeting attended. Visitors are welcome and pay £6 per meeting attended.

**BENEFITS OF MEMBERSHIP:** Firstly, you'll benefit from the skills and expertise of fellow quilters as well as a reduced attendance fee. We have an extensive library for the use of members, for a small borrowing fee. We also hold an exhibition every two years (the next one is in 2024) and you will have the opportunity to show your work.



People on low incomes may be eligible for Housing Benefit, Council Tax Support and Discretionary Housing Payment from the council. This will depend on your current circumstances. You may also be eligible for a Council Tax Discretionary Hardship Payment, Crisis Grant or Community Support Grant Payment.

#### Maximise Your Income

Anyone who is struggling financially can get a benefit check and speak to an advisor for free and confidential advice. A benefit check can ensure that you are receiving all the money you're entitled to, especially if your dircumstances have changed recently. Speaking to an advisor could also help you find cheaper deals on things like gas and electricity and make sure you're not missing out on things like eschool clothing grants or free school meals.

Debt can happen to anyone. Free advice and support can help you find ways to manage your debts and reduce how much you pay each month.

#### Benefit Advance

If you have made a new claim for benefit and are in financial hardship while you wait for your first payment, you may be able to get an advance to afford things like rent or food, it's important to get advice before taking out an advance. Benefit advances must be paid back, and the money will be taken from your future benefit payments (a loan).

#### Hardship Payment

If you have been sanctioned, you may be able to request a hardship payment from the Jobcentre. Hardship payments are not always paid immediately, and they're not available to everyone. Hardship payments of Universal Credit need to be paid back (a losn), but hardship payments of Job Seelkers Allowance or Employment Support Allowance do not (not a loan).

#### Challenge a Decision

You can challenge a benefit decision if your benefit has been stopped / sanctioned / reduced / refused or you have been overpaid. Most benefit decisions need to be challenged
