Rob Pocock: SUTTON PARK AUTUMN NATURE TOUR - REPORT

I was delighted with another highly successful Guided Autumn Nature

Tour of Sutton Park Nature Reserve on Saturday 1st October, many thanks to all Banners Gate and New Oscott residents who came along. Once again we got a top class briefing from Matthew, our expert Park Ranger who is a fount of all knowledge on these tours of the land restoration work. He was justly proud of the stunning restoration of the forest floor that has happened following the controversial felling of the outgrown holly woods 7 years ago. The picture here [pic] shows exactly what it was all meant to achieve. Under the thick canopy of the old holly woods, the dark forest floor was as dead as a dodo. But now you can see:

- Grass growing on and beside the forest paths
- Holly re-growth as fresh ground grazing (people said it would never re-grow!)
- Birch saplings springing up in the glades, perfect insect and caterpillar habitat
- We spotted Rowan seedlings growing up again – trees lost to the Park for many years during the overgrowth of the holly woods Bilberry also re-establishing with berries an ideal autumn bird food store.

In summary, a pattern of live, green forest



glades is emerging where just 7 years ago the excessive holly had resulted in nothing but bare and lifeless soil. The City Council got a lot of flak when the

felling started but our Park Rangers are true specialists who know what they are doing. And they are leaving future generations with a much better Nature Reserve than we have had for many years.

Don't forget, these are annual tours that I first started in the autumn of 2016 when the tree felling controversy broke out and any local resident can take part – just email me



Sutton Coldfield Volunteers Needed

Re-engage, the charity dedicated to ending loneliness and isolation among those aged 75 and over, is urgently seeking volunteers to help run a new social group in Sutton Coldfield.

It already stages monthly gentle activity groups for carpet curling and indoor bowls in Northfield and Garretts Green and is now expanding to other parts of Birmingham.

The charity believes no-one is too old to make friends or enjoy social interaction. Re-engage engagement officer, Deb Meynell, said: "Our groups are fun, friendly, completely free and provide an opportunity to stay physically active.

"Social isolation and loneliness can take a tremendous toll on both mental and physical health, so we hope our groups will give older people something to look forward to and an opportunity to connect with others.

"But before we can press ahead we urgently need volunteers to come forward to help run the groups. It really is rewarding and a great way to feel you are putting something back into society."

Retired nurse Jane, 82, who has seven grandchildren and two great grandsons, said: "The group sessions have helped reconnect me to the outside world. The Covid years altered the structure of a normal life pattern but the sessions bring back a socially safe rhythm to each week. It's a great way to take steps towards reconnecting through an exercise regime."

As well as setting-up in Sutton Coldfield, Re-engage hopes to start groups in Erdington and Harborne. The charity's research shows that 80% of older people taking part in the activity sessions say it has improved their wellbeing.


More Eric stories.

Some interesting well-known sayings gleaned whilst on a recent holiday in Seaton Devon. We visited the 2,000-year-old man made caverns at *Beer Quarry Caves* well worth a visit if you are ever in the area. Beer stone is chalk Limestone laid down in the Cretaceous age (65 – 140 million years ago)

Beer stone is in many prestigious buildings, including Exeter, Winchester, St. Paul's and Norwich Catholic Cathedrals, Westminster Abbey, and the Tower of London. At Exeter Cathedral the great image screen on the west front is of Beer stone, giving it a particularly warm and reflective quality. Much of the Cathedral's interior too, including nearly all the fine carving and the ribbed vaulting originated in this quarry. It can be found in 24 of Britain's 44 cathedrals. The very informative guide led us through the Roman then Saxon period up to the Victorian period of stone extraction. The vast man-made complex of underground caverns with their mighty halls of vaulted roofs and pillars of Beer Stone which have been likened to a vast underground cathedral.

Our guide explained the methods used to quarry and deliver the huge blocks of stone, the working conditions, the hardships endured, and the dangers faced daily by the workforce using only the light from a flickering tallow candle. You may never again see a famous building with the same eyes.

The guide explained that the quarry men were just using picks up to the 16th century and cutting out huge blocks weighing many tons. They had to purchase 5 candles (No not four!) from the mine owners and only got the candle money back if they did 4 tons of stone a man each day. Hence the well-known saying "Not worth the candle".





Due to the hard work quarry men were not long lived. There were ancient markings still visible on walls with quarry men's initials and dates.


















Round like a shot





Two people have been arrested following a spate of robberies targeting school children in Sutton Coldfield.

Two people have been arrested following a spate of robberies targeting school children in Sutton Coldfield.

We are investigating nine robberies that have happened since 13 September where teenagers have been targeted for their mobile phones.

On Friday 6 October we arrested two 13-year-old boys on suspicion of robbery. They've been bailed with strict conditions.

Our investigations into the robberies are still continuing and we need people to come forward with information so that we can identify and take action against anyone that's involved.

Sergeant Frances Clark, from Stechford local policing area, said: "We understand that people have been concerned about the spate of robberies we've seen recently.

"I want to reassure people that we have been working with our partners, local schools and colleagues within the Safer Travel team to ensure the safety of our young people in the area.

"We've held enforcement days and operations and our officers have visited schools to give talks on how to stay safe.

"The arrests are part of the work we are doing and we've been able to put conditions in place which includes ensuring the boys stay away from Sutton Coldfield town centre.

"We believe there was a group of people involved in committing these robberies and need people to continue to come forward with information."

Anyone with information that could help the investigation is urged to call us on 101 quoting 20/853779/23.

Alternatively people can leave information anonymously by contacting Crimestoppers, the independent charity.



<u>Public Space Protection Orders - Dog Control 2023 - Birmingham City Council - Citizens Space (birminghambeheard.org.uk)</u>

On 20 October 2020, Birmingham City Council implemented 5 PSPOs. The PSPOs were brought in to tackle irresponsible dog owners who failed to control or clear up after their dogs. Particular concerns involved dog fouling and dogs that were allowed to roam loose on the roads and straying into children's play areas and onto school land. A full public consultation was carried out prior to the PSPOs being made. These PSPOs replaced those made in 2017.

All PSPOs last for 3 years and then they must be re declared. The current PSPOs will cease to be in effect on 19 October 2023. Birmingham City Council wishes to renew the PSPOs in place and are required to carry out a public consultation.

Saturday 14 October was World Migratory Bird Day and millions of birds are on the move all across the globe. The UK is a vital winter home for huge numbers of birds seeking to avoid harsher winters in the Arctic Circle, Scandinavia and other colder parts of Europe.

Just 6.7% of car thefts result in a conviction, new research shows



Fewer than 7% of car thefts reported to the police result in anyone being charged, with 69% dropped because no suspect can be identified.

Data released by 39 police forces in response to a freedom of information (FOI) request show, between 2019 and 2022, just 6.7% of the 396,000 reported car crimes (car thefts, thefts from a vehicle, and interference with a vehicle) resulted in anyone being charged.

Data was extracted from an FOI request to the Home Office, which covered all territorial police forces in England and Wales. Greater Manchester, Humberside, Staffordshire, and the West Midlands failed to respond to the FOI, which means the true scale of the UK's car crime problem could be far higher.

<u>Dash camera</u> specialist Nextbase, which submitted the FOI, claims a lack of video evidence is one of the key reasons why the police are unable to identify the criminals behind the wave of car crimes.

As a result, a new generation of car thieves are getting away with tens of thousands of cars and car parts every year.

Nextbase also surveyed 2,000 drivers in the UK to understand what security measures are being used to combat car thieves.

Roughly half of drivers (51%) rely on their car alarm, while 25% says they park their vehicle in a place where it is visible from their home. 23% keep their keyfob away from windows or doors to prevent it being cloned, while 17% have a dash cam and 16% use a steering lock.

Just 6% of respondents to the survey said they do not take any measures to keep their car safe.

Common tactics used by thieves includes <u>hacking</u> keyless technology-enabled vehicles and stripping cars of their parts while on the roadside or left in a car park.

By parking in well-lit areas, using <u>steering wheel locks</u>, and not leaving valuable items visible in the car, you can reduce the risk of becoming victims of car crime.



"The image many people have of car thieves breaking windows and hot-wiring cars is totally out of date," says car hacking expert and chief technology officer at automotive security software company Canis Automotive Labs, Dr. Ken Tindell.

"With the latest theft techniques the criminal can relay the wireless messages from the driver's key fob all the way to the car - telling it to unlock itself and deactivate its immobilizer. Or they clone a key fob to tell the car that the thief is the legitimate driver.

"These techniques can let the thief drive away in seconds, without raising any alarm, before a car owner would have any idea what was going on."

CALLING ALL QUILTERS! OR ARE YOU INTERESTED IN LEARNING ABOUT QUILTING? WANT TO IMPROVE YOUR SKILLS AND TECHNIQUES? WHY NOT COME TO OUR GROUP?





Sutton Coldfield Trinity Quilters was founded in 1996, our aims are to further the skill and art of patchwork and quilting. We meet at Holy Trinity Parish Church, Mill Street twice per month: the second Tuesday evening from 7.30-9.30 pm and the fourth Wednesday afternoon from 2.30-4.30 pm. Our programme runs from September to July each year.

ABOUT OUR MEETINGS: Our meetings are varied: we invite quilters to come along to give talks, demonstrations and workshops in their particular specialism, as well as sit and sew meetings, social evenings, demonstrations. We also have regular workshops and Show and Tell evening. We have two trips a year, one to the Malvern Quilt Show in May and another to a quilting outlet for retail therapy (different each year).

Our new programme commenced on 12 September 2023 and we have a good mix of speakers, workshops, sit and sew sessions.

WHO CAN JOIN? Anyone who is interested in patchwork and quilting - you don't need to be an expert! We positively welcome beginners to the craft and members are more than willing to share their knowledge. In addition, one of our members is a qualified P&Q teacher and runs workshops and classes in and around Sutton Coldfield.

WHAT KIND OF THINGS DO YOU MAKE? Quilts aren't just things you put on beds: we make bags, cushions, even clothing! Quilts can be "traditional" or modern, contemporary, illusions, memory quilts, pictures, miniatures, etc. If you are a complete beginner, start by making a bag or small cushion or cot quilt. Many members also make quilts for Linus UK, a charity which gives quilts to children and young people in hospital, hospice or in need. Whilst we do not "make" things at meetings, we have demonstrations and workshops and some sit and sew sessions. We have a collection of "how to" notes and patterns for beginners to help start their quilting journey.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST? Members pay an annual subscription of £20, due in September (or £10 from January), plus £4 for each meeting attended. Visitors are welcome and pay £5 per meeting attended.
