

Station very interesting. A big thank you to Dawn and Nikki for organising the tour.








- be fruits in syrup

Plain cow's milk



This needs to be plain cow's milk, which is pasteurised, sterilised, long-life or ultraheat treated (UHT).



(X) It cannot be:

- flavoured
- coloured
- evaporated
- condensed
- plant-based milk
- powdered (unless it's stage one infant formula)

Infant formula



It should be:

- suitable from birth
- made from cow's milk

Healthy Start vitamins

You can use your NHS Healthy Start prepaid card to collect free Healthy Start vitamins.

If you live in England, find your nearest vitamin provider on the NHS Healthy Start website: www.healthystart.nhs.uk

If you live in Wales, ask your midwife or health visitor where to collect your vitamins.



What is NHS Healthy Start?

If you're pregnant or have children under the age of four you could get payments every four weeks to spend on:

- fresh, frozen or tinned fruit and vegetables
- infant formula milk
- fresh, dried, and tinned pulses

You could also get free Healthy Start vitamins.

- £4.25 each week of your pregnancy (from the 10th week of your pregnancy)
- £8.50 each week for children from birth to one year old
- £4.25 each week for children between one and four years old

Your money will stop after your child's fourth birthday, or if you no longer receive benefits.



Who can apply?

You could qualify for the NHS Healthy Start scheme if you're at least 10 weeks pregnant or you have at least one child aged under four.

In addition, you must be receiving any of the

- Child Tax Credit (only if your family's annual income is £16,190 or less)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Pension Credit (which includes the child
- Universal Credit (only if your family's takehome pay is £408 or less per month from employment)

You will also be eligible for NHS Healthy Start if:

- you're under 18 and pregnant, even if you are not claiming any benefits
- you claim income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) and are over 10 weeks pregnant
- you or your partner get Working Tax Credit run-on only. (Working Tax Credit run-on is the Working Tax Credit you receive in the four weeks immediately after you have stopped working for 16 hours or more per week)

You'll need to activate your card to get your PIN before using it



Shop for healthy food and milk in most retail stores that sell the eligible food and milk items and accept Mastercard® payments



You'll need to insert your card into the card reader and enter your PIN the first time you use your card

Your card will be topped up with your benefit every four weeks.

You can also use your card to collect free Healthy Start vitamins.







Sutton Coldfield NNS Story of Difference



A FRIENDLY FACE! HALHEL DE YMCA AWATTS

This months story of difference shines a light on the success of our Volunteer Fair. On 17th April, Sutton Coldfield NNS welcomed over 20 local community groups and around 50 citizens along to the United Reformed Church for the much anticipated event.

As a team, we are all too aware of the difficulties community organisations have in finding and keeping volunteers. With such a giving local community and a demand for volunteers, the Sutton Coldfield NNS decided to hold a Volunteer Fair and were delighted with how the day panned out.

With such a great turn out of local residents and community providers, many matches were made and contact details swapped. To celebrate the success of the event we have assembled a handful of quotes and stories from attendees who benefitted from the event:

Citizen 1:

The first local resident who we will shine the spotlight on is a retired gentleman in his 70's who wanted to "give back to the community," and "keep my mind and body active," as well as "making new friends" as he had been feeling isolated in recent times. He had found out about the event after checking out the community noticeboard in his local supermarket and had been considering volunteering for sometime. When asked whether he had enjoyed the event, he replied "yes, it has been very useful, I've made some good contacts and found lots of really interesting information. There is a lot to think about and look forward to." He spoke to a number of our table holders and is hoping to contact at least two of them, which offer volunteering opportunities which suit his living situation, accessibility and availability. Such a success story shows the importance of community events, as both the local resident, who can maintain his health and wellbeing and make connections with others, and the local community group, who have found an eager and optimistic new volunteer, benefit from the interaction.

Citizen 2:

The second resident to be highlighted is a lady in her 60's. She has a background in admin but left the workplace during Covid. When speaking to our team, she said that giving up work had left her feeling "like a spare part," and that now was "the right time to get out the house and get motivated." She found out about the Fair after 'Look Local' put a poster through her letterbox and said she could not wait to attend and find out what was on offer. She told us that she spoke to "three organisations," and now "cannot wait to be useful!" Again, our wonderful local groups have gained a new volunteer, whilst a local resident will now be active and busy, which is really positive to hear.

CAPTURING IMPACT

THE IMPORTANCE OF STORYTELLING

For grassroots groups in our constituency, storytelling and capturing impact has never been more important. There are a number of reasons why it is important to capture impact effectively:

FUNDING- It makes you appealing to future funders.

PROMOTION- It allows you to promote your activity effectively.

REQUIREMENTS- It is often a requirement of funding applications.

JOY- It is a great feeling to look back on the difference your group has made.

You can make yourself more attractive to funders and truly capture the impact of your work on local citizens by doing the following:

<u>SHOW</u>- Nothing quite captures the essence of your activity quite like pictures and videos of smiling beneficiaries taking part in your activity.

TELL- Stories of difference of attendees are a great tool. Give context on why they chose your activity, how they found out about you, how they have benefited and where they would be without your support.

HIGHLIGHT- Both qualitative and quantitative data are great.

Quantitative data includes **stats and figures** of how many people you have supported, the demographic groups you have worked with and new recruit figures. Such stats reflect the work you have put in to grow your activity and make it accessible to all.

<u>BUILD-</u> You know the story of your group and it's beneficiaries better than anyone so make sure you build and portray the **narrative.** If you have overcome challenges, let people know how you did. If members of the group came up with a certain idea, include that too.

<u>FOCUS-</u> The best reports focus on what it is the funder is asking for. If they are asking about certain **outcomes**, make sure you mention how you have met them.

<u>SING-</u> Reporting and capturing impact is a chance to display all of your hard work so make sure you **sing your own praises**.

Annual health checks for those who are diagnosed with dementia

Information for those who are living with dementia, their families, loved ones and carers

Are you a person living with dementia or do you care for somebody that is living with a type of dementia? (for example Alzheimer's disease, Vascular Disease, Frontotemporal Dementia).

Did you know that if you are diagnosed with dementia, you are entitled to a free annual health check. It is important to undertake annual health checks and it is a key part to an individual's care and well-being.

What is an Annual Health check?

An Annual Health Check is a discussion between you and a Health Care
 Professional (Nurse, Advanced Health Practitioner, GP) to see how things are
 going and offer local support on matters which you may find challenging.



Why do you need an Annual Health Check?

 The health check will help you keep healthy and get the right support you need if there are any changes to your body or the way you are feeling

How do you get an Annual Health Check?

Each year the patient will be contacted by their registered GP Practice before
their annual health check is due. If you provide support to a person living
with dementia, and want to arrange an annual health check, then please
contact your GP Practice.

What if you want an Annual Health Check but haven't had one?

- You or a member of your family can contact your GP Practice and ask for an Annual Health Check appointment
- Tell your GP Practice that you have dementia so they can give you the right health check

How long does an Annual Health Appointment last?

20-30 mins



What help might you need?

- Ask for help if you feel that you might be distressed about going to the GP Practice by yourself
- If you find it hard to tell the Health Care Professional how you are feeling or are worried about having an health check, you can take a member of your family or someone that knows you well
- Maybe write down a list of questions you might want to ask the Health Care Professional

What heppens during the Annual Health Check?

- The Health Care Professional will ask all about you and how things are at home
- · Review medication/weight/height and carry out blood tests
- . Identify any changes in behaviour and offer some solutions
- Review planning for the future conversations by identifying a person's wishes and preferences
- Offer personalised support by referring the patient or someone who is caring for them to a number of services including: Dementia advisors, Social support, finance support, <u>Birmingham Carers Hub</u>, <u>Carers Trust</u> Solihull, <u>Alzheimer's Society</u>, <u>Memory Assessment Service</u>





